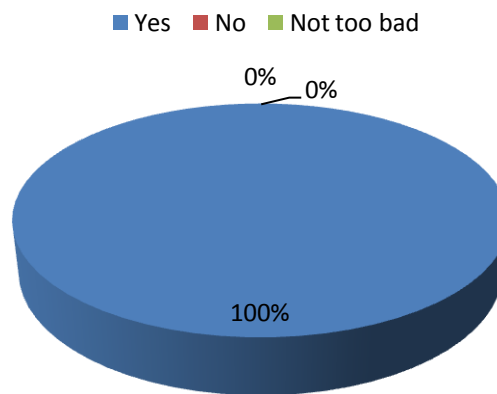

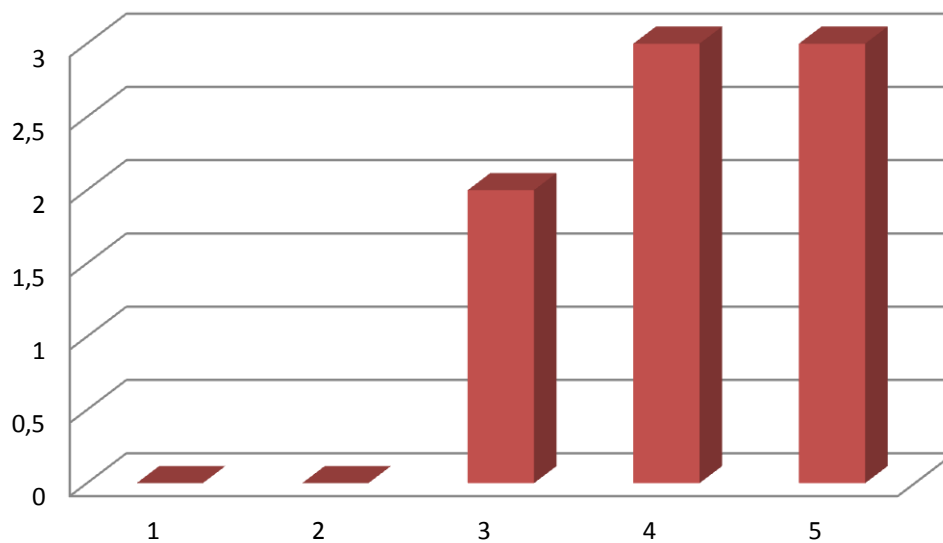

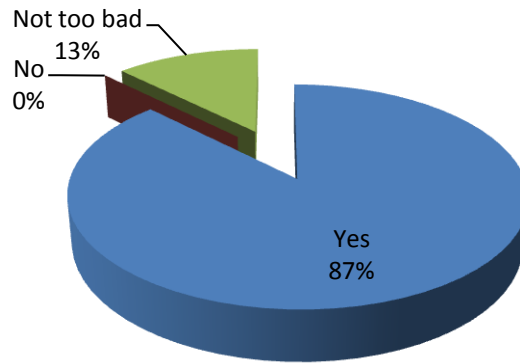
1. Have you enjoyed the visit to our school?



2. If the answer is affirmative, say in which grade from 1 to 5 (5 is the highest)

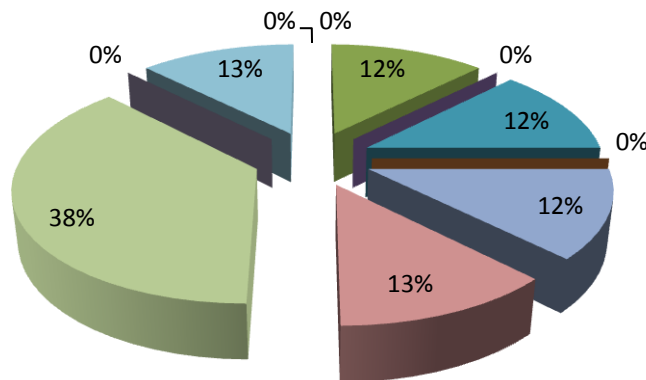


3. Did you like the presentation of the different countries, announcement of the winning logo and the song performed by all the children and teachers?

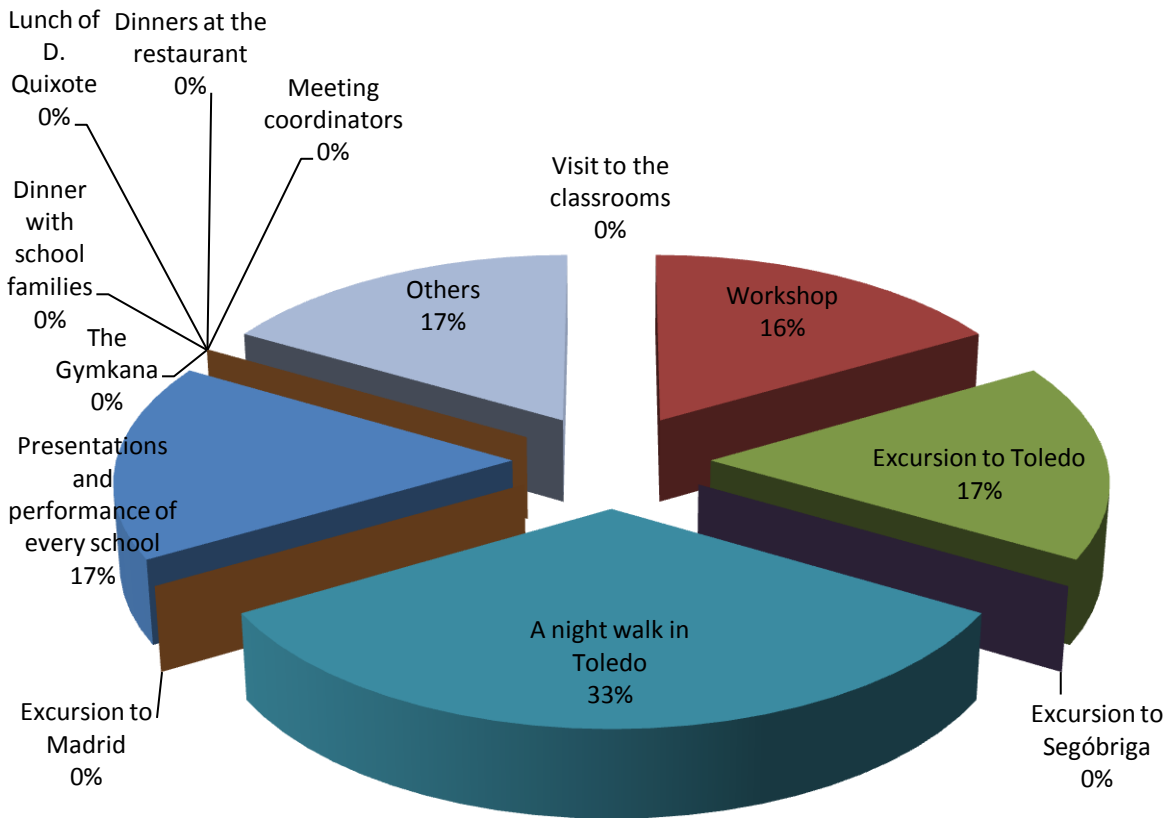
