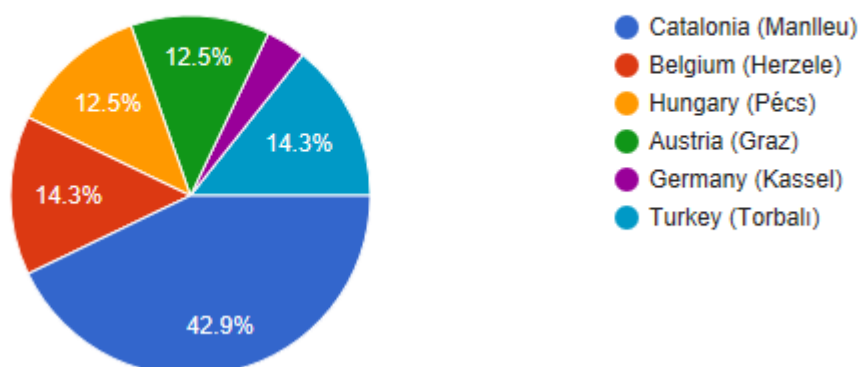


Evaluation of the survey after every meeting

Meeting in Catalonia:

Where are you from? (56 responses)



73.2% of the respondents were students, 26.8% were teachers.

19.6% were male; 80.4% were female.

83.9% of the respondents indicated that they knew what to expect before attending the meeting.

All respondents (100%) were happy to get in touch with the host families beforehand.

All respondents (100%) said they made friends during the meeting. 92.9% of the respondents wants to stay in touch after the meeting.

96.4% of the respondents indicated that they got an insight into the culture of the host country.

All respondents (100%) enjoyed the activities in the host country (Spain). 94.6% of the respondents found what they have learnt useful. 89,3% said they would be able to teach others what they have learnt during the meeting.

All respondents (100%) would recommend this project to other teachers and students.

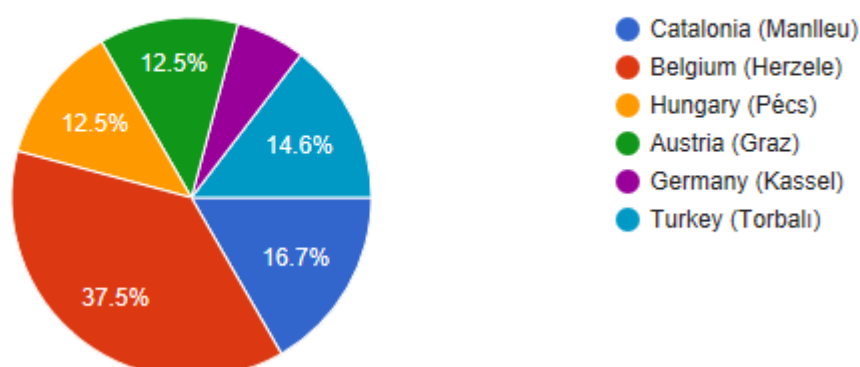
10.7 % of the respondents encountered difficulties during the meeting.

62.5% of the respondents were students, 37.5% were teachers.

27.1% were male; 72.9% were female.

77.1% of the respondents indicated that they knew what to expect before attending the meeting.

All respondents (100%) were happy to get in touch with the host families beforehand.

All respondents (100%) said they made friends during the meeting. 95.8% of the respondents wants to stay in touch after the meeting.

Language: not every pupil could speak English.

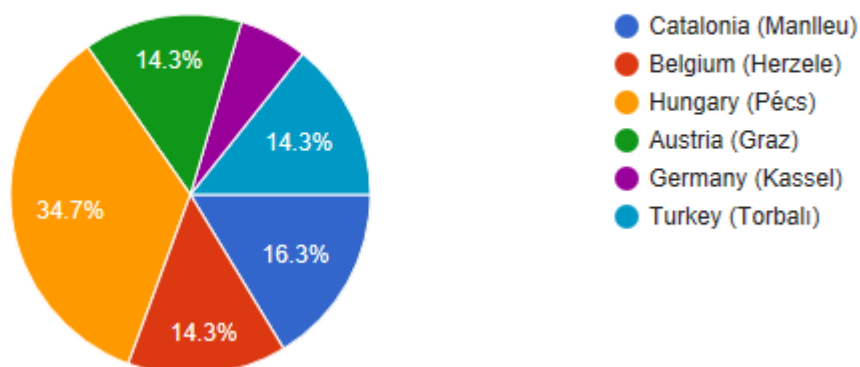
We didn't understand the guest pupil because of poor English.

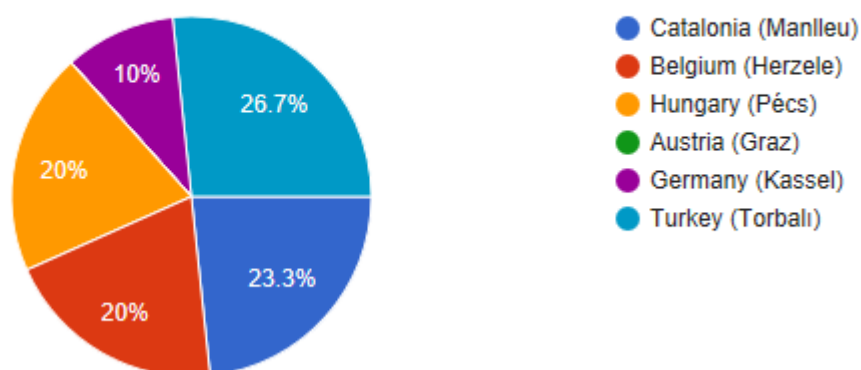
95.9% of the respondents felt that the project helps them to challenge difficulties they encounter in education.

All respondents (100%) felt that the project helps them to challenge difficulties they encounter in education.

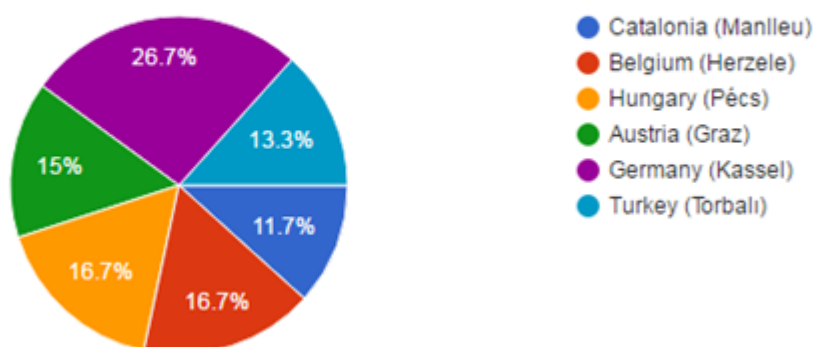
All respondents (100%) would recommend this project to other teachers and students.

86.7% of the respondents felt that the project helps them to challenge difficulties they encounter in education.

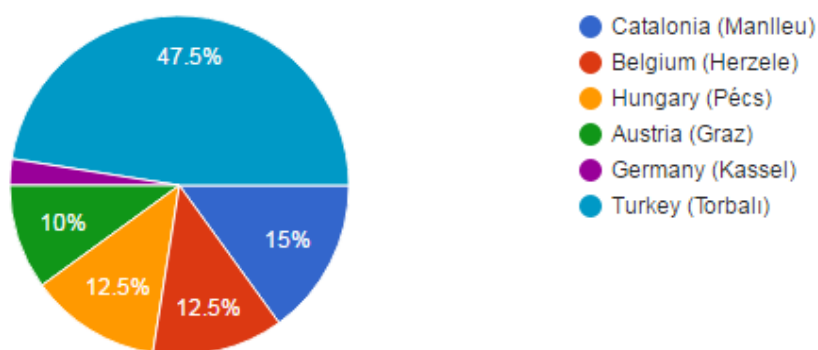
96.7% of the respondents would recommend this project to other teachers and students.
