Zagreb is the capital of Croatia.
Zagreb's population is 803.900.
It is known for its parks,
museums, squares, theatres...



Zlatar Bistrica's geographic position is on the north-west of Croatia.
There is about 2000 people living in Zlatar Bistrica.



In the Science Park Oroslavje you can see the musical fence, sound mirror, wooden accordion and a giant xylophone.



Trakošćan Palace is a cultural property, it is a protected historical site consisting of a castle, a castle building, a park and a forest park with a lake.



Krapina Neanderthals site at the Hušnjakovo locality is the first paleontological natural monument in Croatia and is one of the most significant paleoanthropological localities worldwide



The sanctuary at Marija Bistrica became a national sanctuary in 1715. The present church is 13.80 meters high, 37.40 meters long and 9.80 meters wide.



The Šumarica educational trail is part of the health trail.

The trail is 2 km long. Lesson panels describe Djurek Forest, wildlife from our history, forest site, rare and endangered plants.





With its exceptional natural beauty, this area has always attracted nature lovers, and already on 8 April 1949, it was proclaimed Croatia's first national park.
