



Eco - Project: Waste

Monday 29th of May, Group 1 to 4 started in the auditorium. Miss D. has read a story about our new theme: waste

Back in the classroom, group 1-2 A found a mountain of garbage that children had to sort in the good box: Textiles, Plastic, Old Paper, Solid Waste, Glass and Biodegradable Waste.

We were limited in time that's why we looked in the afternoon if the waste was sorted correctly. It was good thing to do, because it did not work out completely

During the lessons, there was a lot of crafting with free material that children had collected at home in the previous weeks and brought to school. One group worked together and designed a castle.

Others started working with the teacher's ideas: "Embroidery on the anti-slip mat, weave between straws, making a paperclip chain, making a calico craft, making a vase of jam jar coated with wires, crafting spinners from CDs, weaving paper, building a parking garage etc. "

Working with different types of bubble wrap was also exciting experience! The home-made games (marble runway, quoits, throwing cans, marble throw for points in an egg carton) and the music bottles were a great success. The teacher played a song on the bottles, which S. had pre-filled from "empty to full" with water. The toddlers immediately knew what it was. Well done! After that, several children kept doing that..





Making music with litter was also very inspiring! The teacher conducted the orchestra with a straw. Pupils had to play silent and loud on demand, then they combined it with the earlier learned rhythmic verse. It was a hilarious thing to do. Really enjoyable and especially very surprising! Blow, squeeze, whistle, shake and so on It was a blessing of sounds!



In addition to all those activities, children also received a lot of information, learned a verse, new concepts and watched and talked about waste This stimulated them to spontaneous clean-up actions on the playground in the park. Very proud and surprised showed the children the mess that had been thrown away by adults. In the classroom the capture (one of the pupils even called "float waste") was discussed.



At the end of the week there was an exhibition which attracted a big amount of interested in this topic from outside. All the children were allowed to visit all other classrooms to see what the other children had made. We can say it was a big success!
