#### Flood Relief Friday Raises over £1400

A big 'Thank You!' to our students, staff, and of course Parents and Carers who supported our extra non-uniform day' on Friday 8<sup>th</sup> January. We raised nearly £1400 from the non-uniform day collection and also £131 from a bake sale organised by some of the Year 8 girls. Added to our donation from the non-uniform day on the last day of term in December, this means you have helped us to raise over £2,400 so far.

On Tuesday 26<sup>th</sup> January, one month on from the day of the Boxing Day floods, 'Calderdale Kids Fill Their Boots for Flood Relief' will be a second optional fundraising day. We will be asking students to wear their boots to school – welly boots, baseball boots, walking boots, or whatever, and give £1 to the fund again. There will also be 'boot' related activities so watch out for further news. This event is in conjunction with the Calderdale Primary School PTA's and the Community Foundation for Calderdale and we hope to raise even more money for the local families and schools hit by the disaster.

We do realise that some parents and carers may be struggling in these difficult times, which is why this event is voluntary, but we also know that our school community is very generous in times of need. Thank you for your support so far, let's hope we can help make even more of a difference for our community.

#### **Carol Concert Raises £390 for Overgate Hospice**

Another example of the generosity of our school community is demonstrated in the very kind donations given by the congregation and local businesses who supported our annual Carol Concert at St Bartholomew's Church in Ripponden, in aid of Overgate Hospice, just before Christmas. The students and staff created a magical event and we'd especially like to thank Mr Grimes and the Music and Dance departments for all their hard work.

#### 'Peer Mentor' System in Development

Some of our **Year 12** and **Year 10** students undertook some training with the charity Kidscape before Christmas, with a view to setting up a student Peer Mentor System in school for any student who feels they need someone to talk to about issues with school work, relationships with their fellow students, worries about workload etc. The scheme is now in development and we intend to get it up and running in the next few weeks. It will be run by the students and overseen by Pastoral Staff. If any of our students feel they need someone to talk to but would prefer talking to someone nearer their own age, look out for the posters and assemblies that will be coming up soon!

The quarter-final was won in emphatic style with outstanding performances from Harry Georgiou, William Scrimshaw, Oliver Waite and Ben Horner. The opposition were from St Marys in Hull and despite their determination, they were beaten convincingly 42-6.

#### **Cross Country**

The Calderdale Schools Cross Country Championships took place at Crossley Heath on Wednesday 13<sup>th</sup> January. Ryburn had teams competing in the Years 7, 9, and 11, with over 70 pupils participating in each race. We had outstanding performances from Year 7 boys, Travis Atherton finished 5<sup>th</sup> and Harvey Oldroyd came 7<sup>th</sup>. Jessica Russell finished 10<sup>th</sup> in the Year 9 girls race, with Amy Cowton (1<sup>st</sup>), Anna Butterworth (4<sup>th</sup>), Sian Beeley (7<sup>th</sup>), and Sam Chilvers (3<sup>rd</sup>) outstanding in the Year 11 races. As these pupils finished in the top ten they have qualified to represent Calderdale in the West Yorkshire Championships.
