Test your entrepreneurial attitude

The TAI, Entrepreneurial Aptitude Test, is a self-report tool for measuring entrepreneurial potential, the full version consists of 75 items, available at http://cd.univr.it/tai_sole. Designed by Professor Giuseppe Favretto, Director of the Centre Youth Entrepreneurial University of Verona. In the demo version (of only 15 questions) presented here, the test is compiled by assigning each item a score from one to five based on the degree of agreement with the statement. There are no right or wrong answers. Your honest opinion is what counts. To each score is assigned a multiplication factor: the fifteen results are then added together so once you get the total score, you can identify the corresponding profile.
