




**Empower Students with Entrepreneurial Skills**

1. How do you evaluate your teenager's involvement in Erasmus+ Project "Empower Students with Entrepreneurial Skills"?




Regarding the question:




2. Are you satisfied with the results of the activities developed by your teenager in this Project?

in this project influenced your teenager positively?








Concerning the question:




## 4. With this project, your teenager:

Through the analysis of this chart, 26% of the parents consider that their student, by participating in this project, has learned more; 22% improved their performance in English; 18% increased their self-esteem and self-confidence; 17% worked better in a group; 13% were more open to participation in extracurricular activities and 4% used the computer and the internet better.







5. Do you think that the development of this Project enriched the image of your school outdoors?

96% of the parents consider that the development of this Project has positively enriched the external image of the school. Only 4% believe that the development of the project didn't enrich the school image.

## 6. What personal benefits has your teenager gained with his/her involvement in this Project?

Parents pointed out that their teenager...

- Amazing experience for students!






- A very good opportunity to establish relationships outside family relationships.

8. Besides the information given by your teenager and the Project's coordinator,


where can you find additional information about this Project?



Regarding question 8, 43% of the parents report that, in addition to the information provided by their student and the project's Coordinator, they have obtained valid information about the project through the school's website; 22% through the school's Facebook; 19%, through the project's Facebook and 16% through the school newspaper or the local newspaper.







9. Were you encouraged to participate in some of the Project's activities? If your answer is yes, refer the activities, please.


Concerning this issue, 55% of the parents were encouraged to participate in some of the project's activities and 45% were not encouraged.
