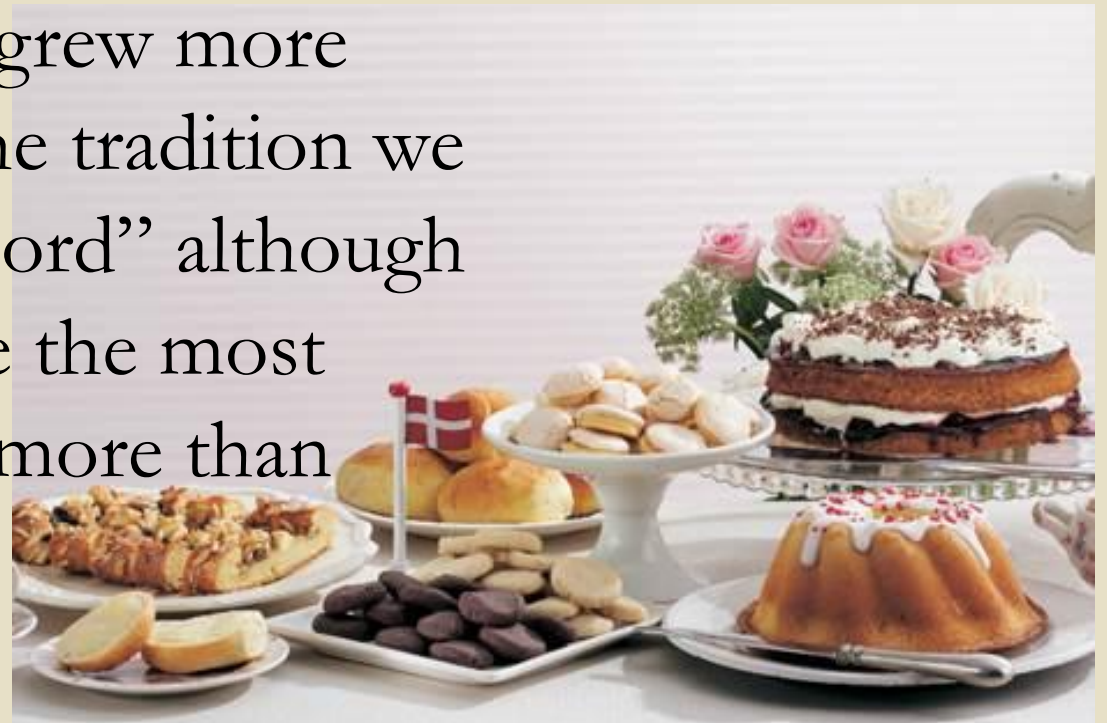




SØNDERJYSK- KAFFEBORD

It's a tradition from South Jutland, that started in the 1800s, when Denmark was in war with the Prussians. The Prussians wouldn't let the Danish people drink alcohol, so instead they met to drink coffee and eat cakes. Over time it grew more popular and slowly evolved into the tradition we know today as "Sønderjysk-kaffeboard" although now it's more of a "who can make the most delicious and best-looking cakes" more than anything.





The "Rules"

“Sønderjysk-kaffeboard” consists of different dry, soft and hard cakes, served with coffee. It consists of a minimum of 14 cakes- 7 soft, and 7 hard. Most people can't make it through more than 3 though!

How to survive a Sønderjysk-kaffeboard

If you want to try out the different cakes, we advise you only to try small pieces of each cake, or you won't make the distance. You also have to be really hungry. It's your responsibility if you start feeling unwell because of the cakes. Now you're warned ☐ .
