Wednesday: We begin the programme on Wednesday morning at 9.00. After the welcome session there will be an introduction by the Danish students.

After that a lecture by the sociologist Aydin Soei who will give you information and insight into the topic of social inclusion.

Sociologist Aydin Soei introduced with his book "Angry young men" the concept of 'un-citizenship' that covers the extra costs - in particular young ethnic minority men in vulnerable neighbourhoods - feel that they have to pay in comparison to most other young people in Denmark.

The experience of 'un-citizenship' and injustice is crucial when it comes to young people falling outside of society who chooses to seek a subcultural recognition in gangs, radical groups and in areas that are often called "ghettos" in the public debate. In this lecture Aydin Soei will talk about social integration and the background for ending up in the crime and unemployment stats and he will talk about the concept of citizenship in Denmark compared to other western countries.

About Aydin Soei: Aydin Soei is one the most influential authors and thinkers in Denmark when it comes to young people in stigmatized neighbourhoods and young ethnic minorities. He has written the books "Guilt", "Angry Young men" and "Reconciliation." The latter has just been published in March and is based on his own family story.

Based on the lecture and on the work you have prepared at home we shall have **workshop 1** after lunch. You will work in mixed groups. See below for content.

Thursday: Our school day begins at 8:10, and you will join your host for his/her lesson until 9:45. Then there is a morning assembly in the hall. We leave the school at 10.00 by bus to go to Østervang which is a local community, some may call deprived. In Østervang Rania Tamim runs a project called "Better Life Together" for young people. The aim is to train them to become role models and to integrate into mainstream Danish society by building a bridge between cultures. Here we shall also meet a group of mothers who support young girls. They call themselves "The local Mothers".

Here you will have **workshop 2** which is to make a video diary. See below for content.

Friday: At 8.10 you will meet the school's student council. They will tell you about the school democracy and how it all works. Do ask and compare! Then there will be a guided tour of the school in small groups. **Workshop 3** begins at 10:00. Now you must come up with innovative ideas based on what you have learned the previous days. Lunch is at 12:00. After that you will meet a panel of our former students who come from backgrounds not easily included in the educational system. They will tell you how they have managed and what obstacles they have faced. In the afternoon your hosts will take care of you.
