in Poland



National Independence Day is a national day in Poland celebrated on 11 November to commemorate the anniversary of the restoration of Poland's sovereignty as the Second Polish Republic in 1918 from the German, Austro-Hungarian and Russian Empires. Following the partitions in the late 18th century,

Poland ceased to exist for 123 years until the end of World War I, when the destruction of the neighbouring powers allowed the country to re-emerge.


POLISH ROADS TO INDEPENDENCE

Notable dates in history

- 5 November 1916 Act of 5^{th} November was released in order to create the Regency Kingdom of Poland
- 14 January 1917 Provisional Council of State had started its activity
- 12 November 1917 Regency Council took over the head of state duties
- 7 October 1918 Regency Council announced Poland's independence
- 23 October 1918 government with the prime minister Józef świeżyński was established, without approval by the German authorities
- 1 November branches of the Polish Military Organization began disarming German and Austrian soldiers
- 6/7 November 1918 in Lublin, Ignacy Daszyński established a Provisional Government of the People's Republic of Poland
- 10 November 1918 Józef Púsudskí came to Warsaw, prevíously released from príson in Magdeburg.

- 11 November 1918 Púsudskí was appointed Commander in Chief by the Regency Council and was entrusted with creating a national government for the restored Polish State.
- 16 November Józef Púsudskí sígned a telegram notífying the creation of an
 independent Polish State. The telegram was sent by radio to the leaders of the
 superpowers and to all of the warring or neutral governments three days later
 with the use of equipment from the Warsaw Citadel, just after exiting the German
 troops.
- 17 November after the resignations of Ignacy Daszyński, Józef Púsudski appointed Jędrzej Moraczewski as the prime minister.

Józef Púsudskí

born 5 December 1867 in Zułów, died 12 May 1935 in Warsaw

Roman Dmowski

born 9 August 1864 in Kamionek, died 2 January 1939 in Drozdów



"We are different, coming from different parts of Poland, and having different interests, yet we are united by one goal.

This goal is our Motherland for which we want to live and work".

Ignacy Paderewskí

born 18 November 1860 in Kurytowiec, died 29 June 1941 in New York



"Poland shall not, shall not perish! It shall thrive for centuries in power and glory.

For us, for you, and for the whole humanity".

Wojciech Korfanty

born 20 April 1873 in the Sadzawka Settlement, currently Siemianowice Śląskie, died 17 August 1939 in Warsaw



"We are a bold and proud nation, and even despite of misfortunes that befell us and the blows that affected us we refuse to bow down as slaves would before the power and the mighty".

Wincenty Witos

born 21 January 1874 in Wierzchostawice, died 31 October 1945 in Kraków



"I am of the opinion that never and nowhere shall it suffice for a state, for its defence and everything else, to have a single man,

no matter how much of a genius. This burden has to be shouldered by the society as a whole".




