## **CONCLUSIONS ABOUT QUESTIONNAIRES (STUDENTS AND TEACHERS)**

### **BEFORE AND AFTER THE PROJECT WEEK IN LJUBLJANA**

(a short summary of the comparison of the results of the questionnaires for students and teachers before and after the project meeting in Ljubljana)

#### **1. STUDENTS**

- Most of the students stated that their knowledge of the Slovenian culture was very poor. The good news is that at the end of the visit, a majority of them could answer some of the questions about Slovenia correctly (about the shape of Slovenia, coat of arms, Jože Plečnik, France Prešeren, Valentin Vodnik).
- Students said that they were very well or even excellently prepared for staying at the Slovenian family. Their expectations about that were really high. According to the results they had a great time with the family. Unfortunately almost half of them believed they didn't have enough time to hang out with their new friends. It is interesting that at the beginning of the week they didn't realize they would need that time so much.
- The students were looking forward to visiting the Postojna cave, the Ljubljana sights and the school. And in fact, the Postojna cave was the favourite place for them. Most of them liked everything about the Ljubljana old town tour too.
- They predicted they would make most progress at the debate workshop but as the matter of fact they were quite critical about the organization and leading of the debate workshop. They also expressed some dislike about the logo/slogan and the workshop presenting the favourite activity.
- Their favourite workshops were rap, clay and presenting the countries. Strangely, none of them was rated very high according to the students' expectations at the beginning of the week.
- The project week in Ljubljana was an exciting, happy and full of fun experience to almost all of the students.

#### **2. TEACHERS**

- Before the project week, teachers thought they were well prepared for the stay and activities.

- They were really enthusiastic about getting to know the new teaching methods, discussing the peer abuse and discrimination problems. The majority were satisfied about what they were offered on that area but it seems that some expected more.
- The teachers were looking forward to visiting the Postojna cave, Prekmurje and the old town of Ljubljana. All three visits met their expectations according to the results of the questionnaire.
- It's interesting to point out that they didn't have much opinion on the Social Centre Rog and on the dinner at the restaurant Druga violina before, but afterwards, they rated the first in the range of the favourite five experiences and the second much higher according to the expectations rate.
- The teachers believe that the debate, logo/slogan and favourite activity workshops were organized and led very well. Their attitude is positive while the students were more critical about those three workshops.
- The teachers think that five students' favourite activities were staying with the families, Postojna and old town of Ljubljana visits, the debate and rap workshops. According to the results the students in fact liked staying with the families, Ljubljana old town and the Postojna cave but on the other hand they say that their favourite workshops were rap, clay and presenting the countries. It's interesting that the teachers predicted students to enjoy the rap workshop while students themselves didn't have much expectations about it.
