• Procedure	<ol> <li>Tell the students they are going to read some statements. They should decide together whether they think the statements are true or false. Ask them to make two separate piles.</li> <li>Put the students into groups of three or four. One student picks up the first card and reads it to the others in the group. The whole group then discusses whether they think the information is true or false. If they think the information is false, they should guess the true answer. When they have decided, the next student picks up the next card, reads it to the others, and so on until all the cards have been discussed.</li> <li>When all the groups have finished their discussions, check the answers with the class.</li> </ol>
• Alternative	The teacher can copy the answers and give them to one student in each group. This student tells the others the answer once they have discussed the statement thoroughly.
