Activity 2

Now read a text about Christopher Columbus and check your answers.

Student A

Christopher Columbus (or Cristoforo Colombo in Italian) was born in 1451 in Genoa, in present-day Italy. As a young boy he spent many days listening to sailors' tales of their voyages. As soon as he could he became a sailor and studied mapmaking and navigation. By the age of 25 he was living in Portugal. At the time explorers were trying to find a sea route to Asia. Some explorers were trying to sail around Africa, but Columbus realised that by sailing west you should reach Asia. Finally, in 1492, King Ferdinand and Queen Isabella, the rulers of Castile and Aragon (in Spain) agreed to give Columbus the money he needed to buy ships and supplies.

Student B

Columbus set sail on August 3rd, 1492. After a short stop in the Canary Islands he sailed west with his three ships – the *Nina*, the *Pinta* and the *Santa Maria*. The voyage was difficult, but on October 12th, after 17 days at sea, they saw land. Columbus thought he had sailed around the world to Asia, but of course he hadn't. Columbus spent ten weeks exploring before sailing back to Spain where he promised King Ferdinand and Queen Isabella gold and jewels. In the next 11 years he made three more voyages, but never discovered gold. Finally, he was sent back to Spain where he died in 1506 at the age of 55.

Preparation

Activity 1: Photocopy of quiz for each student/pair.

Activity 2: Photocopy one per two students & cut into A & B worksheets.

Activity 4: This can be photocopies and given to each student/pair or, written up or read out by you.

Activity 1

- 1 On the board write up Columbus.
- 2 Ask students what they can tell you about him. Encourage the students to use English and write up some of the things they say.
- **3** Tell students they are going to do a short quiz on Columbus, but not to worry as they'll have some choices.
- **4** Put students in pairs and give each pair a copy of the quiz and ask them to work together and discuss the choices.
- **5** Monitor, but don't help or tell the students which answers are correct.
- 6 Tell students you're not going to check the answers yet, but that they will do this in the next activity.

Activity 2

- 1 Split each pair, so you have one student A and one student B.*
- **2** Tell them that you want them to work alone.
- **3** Give student A the worksheet marked Student A and student B the one marked Student B.
- **4** Tell students to read their text and find the answers to three of the questions.
- **5** Monitor, and help where necessary.
- **6** Next, ask the original pairs to sit together and tell each other the answers to the three questions from the quiz that were in their text.
- **7** Finally, check as a class.
- * Alternatively, put students in groups of four. Ask two students to work together as student A and two as student B. Follow the same procedure as above from step 3.

Activity 3

- **1** Ask students to look at the text and ask *What is it?*
- 2 Elicit newspaper article.
- 3 Tell the students that there are six factual mistakes in the text. They should read it and try to find and correct the mistakes.
- **4** Tell the students to try and do it without looking back at the texts from activity 2.





- **5** Give the students five minutes and then put them in pairs and get them to check together.
- **6** Finally, check as a class or get them to refer back to the texts from activity 2 and check.
