The main idea of the lesson is to make students familiar with the UNESCO World Heritage List, especially with the Polish monuments .

General objectives

- Presentation of Polish monuments inscribed on the UNESCO World Cultural and Natural Heritage List
- Raising awareness of the beauty of Polish cultural and natural heritage, with particular emphasis on the role they have played throughout history
- Developing the ability to use a historical map.

Operational objectives (after the lesson students know)

- terms: monument; UNESCO World Cultural and Natural Heritage List
- places with the most valuable monuments in Poland
- the meaning of the concepts learned
- can list and describe in a few sentences selected Polish monuments from the UNESCO World Cultural and Natural Heritage List: Wieliczka Salt Mine; The Royal Castle in Warsaw; Wawel Royal Castle in Krakow; The Old City in Warsaw; The Old Town in Toruń; Concentration Camp Auschwitz-Birkenau in Oświęcim; Malbork Castle; Białowieża Forest.

Teaching materials

- A multimedia presentation presenting monuments from the Cultural





- and Natural World Heritage UNESCO List.
- Physical map of Poland, contour maps.

Methods

- A talk with elements of discussion
- Working with an iconographic source
- Working with the map
- Brainstorming

Stages of the lesson

<u>Introduction to a new topic:</u>

In lesson students talk about the monuments of Poland from the UNESCO World Cultural and Natural Heritage List. What is their uniqueness that they have been entered on such a list?

Task for students

What is a monument? What features should an item have in order to be a relic? (brainstorming with sticky notes)
