It is the capital of the Municipality Kymis-Aliveriou






Our school is the 2nd Geniko Lykeio Aliveriou

- The students come from rural areas and small villages of the surroundings of Aliveri.
- Some students come from disadvantaged socio-economic families.
- There are also minimum immigrants and some student with special needs (dyslexia mostly).
- Our school is co-located with the Vocational School (EPAL) and the Second Chance School.



Greek Upper Secondary Education System

In Greece students have 2 choices in Upper Secondary Education; they choose between General education and Vocational training.

Our school is a General Lyceum with 125 students and 15 teachers.

Students attend a three-year post-compulsory education.


- The second year of the General Lyceum allows students to specialise within one of two option streams,
 - 1. Humanities & 2. Science, IT & Health Studies
- The third year they specialise within one of three option streams,
 - 1. Humanities 2. Science and 3. Economics and Informatics.

There is also a common core of General Education:

 Religious affairs - Modern Greek - Greek literature – History – Biology -Foreign language - Mathematics - Social sciences history & Physical Education
