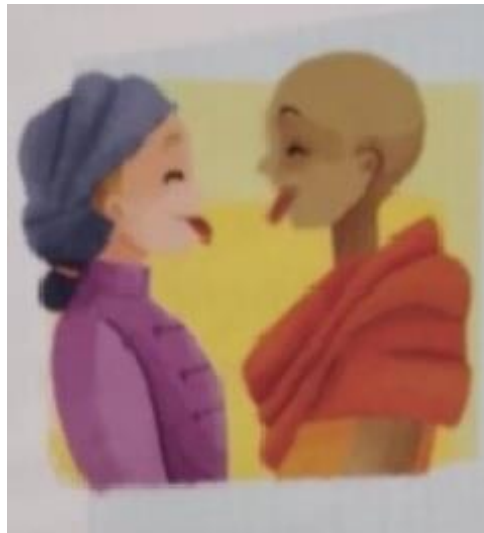




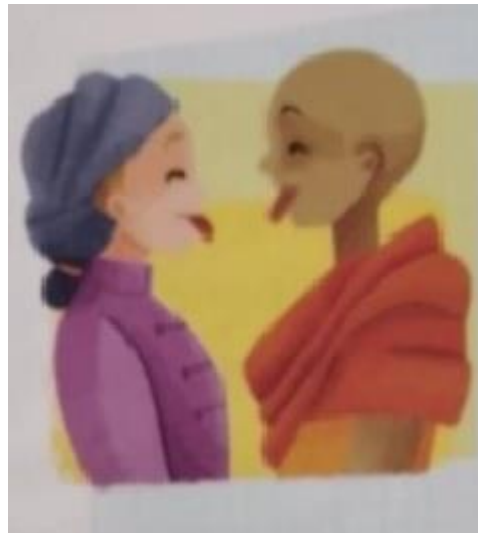
... and bow their heads slightly, saying: 'Namaste'.
