

Postermywall

Create impressive posters easily and quickly.



Postermywall can be used for posters or flyers, for banners, as well as for invitations or collages of images. The free version includes all the above with a small watermark at the edge of the image. Account creation (allowed for people over the age of 13) allows you to save your projects to the service for future modification, and even if you use the no-account application, you can make impressive posters or brochures and download them as a picture.

Choose **Create a design - New design**. That will open a window and choose between ready-made themes. We can choose a background from the free options. As soon as we select the background, double-click and opens the poster's edit window. In the right column we can choose the size of our creation, give a title and brief description.

We begin creating the poster by adding pictures or adding text and then editing the text with the window that opens right (font, size, color, etc.). We can also add flashy text with the Add Fancy text option in the left column. Again we write the text by selecting an effect, font, colors, etc. from the window that opens, and then select Add to Poster to add to our poster.

We can change the size and location of images and texts until we are ready. Click Save draft. Then choose Download from the top bar and save the image.

We can also share our image on social media or share the link by choosing Share and giving it a name again. Share your poster online, by copying the embed code. Or we can choose let others edit your poster and invite them to edit our poster by submitting their emails.



Class postermymwall collaborative posters

We create a Classroom account or upgrade our existing account to classroom account. As a teacher, we can choose MY STAFF and then NEW to create a Class Project. He asks us to enter a code for this class project. We tell our students to go to the postermymwall and by clicking Log in choose Log in as student when they ask for the password. Once they've created the code, they can create posters that are stored in the class project and all students can access all the posters of the same class project so they can edit all the images. So the final posters are the result of collaborative students in different schools!
