

# TUTORIAL FOR MAKING PRESENTATIONS STATUES - Inspiring people

#### A. START THE WORK PROCESS

- 1. Find a name for your workgroup!
- 2. Appoint the team leader!
- 3. Organize the work! Who is responsible for which task?
- 4. Open the **Twinspace/Pages/P10 Zagreb (scroll down)/Day 2** on your computers for the materials and links!
- 5. Open What's App Web for easy transfer of field trip pictures!

#### **B. PRESENTATION LAYOUT**

- 1. **Presentation name: WK NR Statues and Persons.pptx** (you can work in any presentation program)
- 2. Introduce the team name, the team members and the team leader!!
- 3. Explain how you worked!
- 4. Show large pictures on your slides!
- Write the answers on the slide with key words (the least possible number of words).
  Max. 3 prompts/bullits (answers) should be on one slide.
  (No full sentences should be on slides.)
- 6. Finish the presentation with a **Reference List (Sources)** of the visual and textual material that you used and that does not belong to you!
- 7. Upload presentation: Upload presentation and text

### C. SPEECH TUTORIAL

- 1. **Prepare your speech** to go along with the presentation in a text document. **Text document name:** WK *NR* Statues and Persons.docx
- 2. Write the speech **in a simple manner** using spoken language. Do not use the language from the text you found.
- 3. Expand the prompts/bullets (your answers) from the slides with your own words. The following questions can help you stretch your sentences. Who? Did what? When? Where? Why?
- 4. After writing your own sentences you will be able to **talk freely** about the topic because you used the words that you know and you will be familiar with the topic. You **must not read** your speech.
- 5. Make sure you know how to **pronounce** all the words you have used. Make an effort to understand and pronounce the words in languages other than English.
- 6. **Upload** the document with your speech onto the following link: <u>Upload presentation and text</u>





## D. PARTS OF THE PRESENTATION:

# I. STATUE DESCRIPTION (photos, videos, maps, text)

- 1. Show the photograph of the statue!
- 2. Show the position of the statue on the map! Add an interactive link form Google Maps (if it exists) or drop a new pin, print screen and add print screen!
- 3. Show the surroundings of the statue with a photograph or a short video!
- 4. Describe the location of the statue! Who can see it there?
- 5. Who is the author of the statue? What are the most important information about the sculptor?
- 6. What is the style (artistic/historical...) of the statue? Is there something you like /don't like about the style?

### **II. 3D MODELS OF STATUES**

- Show the animation with the link to the video!
  3DF Model Video name: WK NR Name of Statue.mp4 (youtube)
- 2. How many 3D photos did you try to use for making the 3D Model of your statue?
- 3. How many 3D photos were used for making the 3D Model?
- 4. Is the surface of the 3D Model completely closed?
- 5. Were there any issues when using the 3DF Zephyr? Is the software user friendly?

## III. DESCRIBING THE PORTRAYED PERSON

- 1. Who was the person that this statue is dedicated to?
- 2. When did he/she live?
- 3. What were the circumstances?
- 4. What was his/her job?
- 5. Describe his/her work in short!
- 6. Was this person famous and recognized in his/her lifetime? (Why not?)
- 7. What did he/she do to deserve a statue in his/her honour?
- 8. Can his/her work in a certain field be inspiring or groundbreaking or world-changing?
