In Britain, the Celts opposed the Roman and the Saxon invasions.

Celtic culture was preserved in Ireland, Wales and Scotland.



The History of Halloween

Halloween is derived from *Samhain*, one of the four important Celtic festivals. *Samhain* is the end of the year.



Samhain takes 7 days (Oct 29 - Nov 4th).
The Druids supervise the festival.



The History of Halloween

Halloween is derived from *Samhain*, one of the four important Celtic festivals. *Samhain* is the end of the year.



Samhain takes 7 days (Oct 29 - Nov 4th).
The Druids supervise the festival.

THE LEGEND : at *Samhain*, humans can enter the *Sidh* (the other world) and talk to the dead.

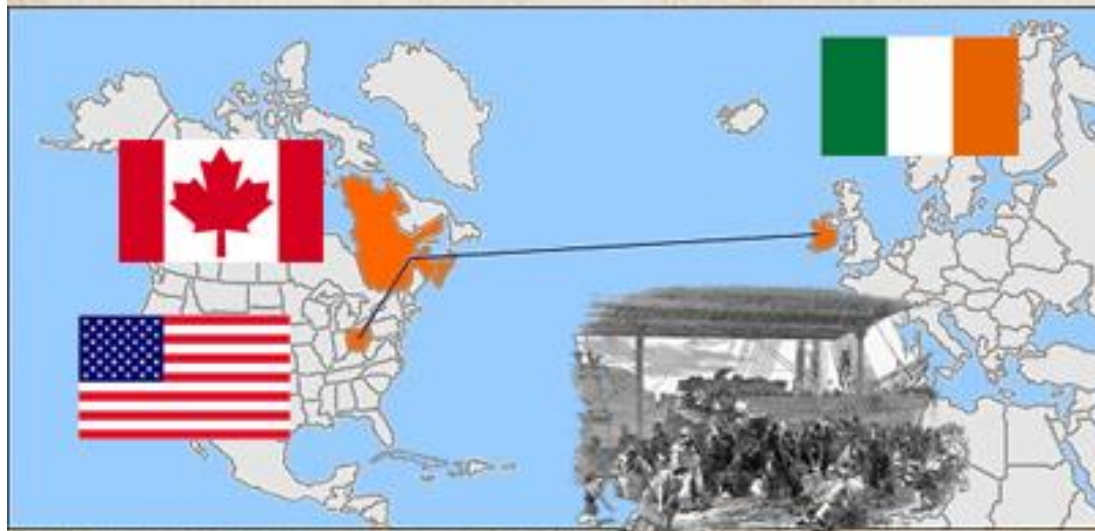

In the 19th Century, a famine forced the Irish to exile to America. **Halloween** developed in the U.S.A., with the first *Jack o'lanterns*.
