CAMERA ANGLES

The camera angles define the point of view of the spectator according to a given character. It changes the meaning of the shot.

EYE-LEVEL ANGLE: The camera is simply set in front of the character or object.

HIGH ANGLE: The view is set above the character or object which looks dominated (in most cases).

LOW ANGLE: The view is set below the character or object which looks dominating (in most cases).

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
