

The Kampa factory in Pallini

The Kampa factory is an area of about 350 acres in Pallini, which was built in 1903. It is one of the first winery factories in our country, in which the Famous Mediterranean wine of the same name was produced. The founder of the factory was Andreas Kampas, who was born in 1851 in Athens, but came from Messini. He had five brothers, but he was the most clever and creative. In 1875 he bought 5,000 acres in Kantza, from Poulcheria Argyropoulou and in 1878 more 3,500 in Spata by the barons Doumba and Bryan. In the 1880s he managed to also produce brandy.

After his death, the company lost its glamor and popularity. Until the end 1990s, had been a fertile area with vineyards in the middle of which there were winery buildings, while continued to operate in wine production and brandy in the Mediterranean until 2000.
