

THE MOST FAMOUS LITERATURE PRIZES



Do you know the most famous literature prizes? If not, read here! First of all **the Nobel Prize in literature**, is awarded every October by the Swedish Academy. Then in England there is the **Booker prize for finction**, in America the **National Book Award** and the **Pulitzer Prize**. In Spain the **Cervantes Prize**, from Miguelle De Cervantes, in France the **Prix Goncourt**, and in Italy, two of the many prizes, are the **Premio Strega** and the **Premio Campiello**. These prizes consider only book written in the country's language. Another in Italy but international prize is the **Premio Bancarella**.

FUN FACT

In the world about 60-70 million books are published, they are read all over the world, the people who read the most are the youngest ranging from 6 to 19 years, in addition there are also the oldest ones ranging from 55 to 65 years are the highest readers.

The largest book that has ever been published is an edition of the Little Prince. A mega version that saw the light in Brazil in 2007. Measurements in meters: height 2.01; width

3.08.

Instead, the longest novel in the world is In Search of Lost Time by Marcel Proust. Seven volumes for over four thousand pages and well over a million words. Their publication took place between 1913 and 1927.

The longest title in the world belongs to a book written by Vityala Yethindra. It contains 26,000 characters.
