The NAME OF THE PROJECT aims to promote the potential of peer learning is designed as a way of moving beyond independent learning to mutual learning. The project is the result of common work of teachers from Italy, Turkey, Poland, Portugal and Greece and is addressed to students aged 15-18.

The core motivation of our project is to develop our students' social competences in terms of social, emotional and cognitive skills necessary for successful social adaptation. The need to carry on such a project at an international level appeared from the fact that working with people from other cultures will develop participants' ability to have another perspective when confronted with a situation, learn from others' experiences and apply learning during social interactions. Students will work together with their EU peers to create project products; this will promote active learning, feel more comfortable and open when interacting with European citizens.

We believe that peer learning is an underutilized resource especially in our times when students seem to be one more step ahead of us. It is our duty as educators to reduce the gap generation because we should keep up the pace with the new trends and our students' needs.

This project should be funded because it uses an innovative approach to the peer to peer learning topic using the digital tools and direct interaction with peers from different countries. Gathering participants with a different social and cultural background, engaging them in activities that stimulates the social and educational value of European cultural heritage will foster social inclusion and group cohesion, values promoted by the ET 2020. The EU values mentioned in the Article 2 of the Treaty on the EU are promoted at an international level.

The project main aim is to boost social competences in terms of social, emotional and cognitive skills among 450 students from 5 European countries during a 24 months project.

The objectives we are looking to achieve are:

- -to raise awareness about social competences among students from 5 EU schools
- -to support students social adaptation during 2 years project
- -to encourage peer to peer learning
- -to foster the students' integration in a globalized world

The target groups to which our project is addressed are:

- -570 students (12-14 years old)
- -110 teachers
- -80 students and 44 teachers from all partner schools will directly attend the project mobilities
- -15 school staff (librarian, accountant, psychologist/ school counselor)
- -120 families
- -50 representatives of the local communities

The concrete results we are looking to produce are questionnaires, project logo and website, eTwinning project, presentations/ audio visual materials: "Countries and schools", "My culture", "Great people. Great communities", "What is social learning?", "How to combat social exclusion?",

The activities will be integrated in the programme of 5 international reunions, 4 of them being meetings with students. The project activities are based on peer to peer learning and cooperative learning approach. When designing the project and its activities we followed the line how students think, feel and grow.

Social-emotional development encompasses students' experience, expression and emotional management, as well as their ability to establish positive and rewarding relationships with their peers. We are going to organize workshops for our students to encourage them to work together and dare to express their creativity.

The core features of social and emotional development include the ability to identify and understand the own feelings, to manage personal emotions, to express them in a constructive manner and to develop empathy for others. As it will be necessary to support each others in acknowledging that each person is responsible for his/ her own learning process, we planned interactive activities to support students in developing their social and emotional perspectives.

The project will bring benefits in the long-term because the school curricula will be developed, teachers will gain hands on experience in using peer-to -peer learning and the ready made project materials (presentations, toolkit, calendar, etc.) will remain available as teaching resources in all partner schools.

All schools will improve their institutional development plans and improve the quality of teaching. Teachers will gain an insight about other EU educational systems and update their teaching styles. The experience will offer an international dimension to the schools, developing the network of contacts with EU schools and increasing schools' visibility at an international level.

The Liceo PASCASINO is currently divided into three areas of study: Linguistico, Scienze Umane and Economico sociale. The building has large Outdoor area, a classroom of natural sciences, physics and chemistry, two multimedia classrooms, equipped with modern computers, a library with a rich video-audio material, a home cinema and a multi-purpose sports field. The schoolalso has a large modern gym and outdoor areas with flowerbeds, small gardens and parking lots. Its staff is formed by 100 employees and the students are about 821. In this district town, which is agricultural, industrial and tourist, the school community feels the need to open to experiences of growth in a larger dimension, not forgetting the themes of European digital citizenship, legality, envinroment and equal opportunities. We consider that a transnational experience may prove fruitful for teachers and staff, not only for professional reasons, but also for cultural ones and it may have positive effects on the entire school community and town. The study of Foreign Languages, Human Sciences, Law, Economics and Music characterize the Pascasino High School, which offers high quality training courses to young people from Marsala. It offers students extra-curricular courses aimed at obtaining certifications in English (Cambridge and CAE), in French (DELF) and in Spanish (DELE). Moreover, strengthened by this linguistic and cultural need, the school community is set to achieve a profitable experience of internationalization, to acquire new teaching techniques, involving and expanding itshorizons and professional skills. Pascasino has been carrying out the EsaBac Project (double Italian/French diploma) and pursues CLIL teaching in English, French, Spanish. Over the last few years, targeted activities have been carried out, concerning the development of a "European feeling": workshops, role-playing, business games, classroom research; the cultural offer has been further enriched with the activation of various upgrading projects according to act 107/2015 including a European citizenship course in English to let students acquire new skills and competences during a training period in European countries. LEARNING TOGETHER aims at promoting the potential of peer learning and it is designed as a way of going beyond independent learning to mutual learning.

The project is the result of common work of teachers from Italy, Turkey, Poland, Portugal and Greece and it is addressed to students aged from 15 to 18.

All partner schools have shared information regarding their national education systems, encouraging teachers to use project-based learning within the educational process. For each school subject, students are challenged to create a project at the end of a chapter or term project research.

Therefore, we decided to explore this common point in bringing our students together to work and support each other in our attempt to promote cooperative and peer-to-peer learning. Students learn from each other during their daily activities, but we consider that formalized peer learning will help them to learn effectively, to develop social skills.

The common needs identified when comparing schools' SWOT analysis were

- -to enhance the quality of education
- -to make students aware that they are responsible for their own learning
- -to reduce discrimination and aggressive behavior.

A research has been conducted in all partner schools and we have concluded that students tend to disrespect and reject others points of view, they lack empathy and they are aggressive with each other.

The percentage of acts of violence reaches 20% in Italy,25% in Turkey,29% in Poland,21% in Greece and 27% in Portugal.

The core goal of our project is to develop our students' social awareness in terms of social, emotional and cognitive skills, considered necessary for successful social adaptation.

The need to carry on such a project on an international level has come up from the fact that working with people from other cultures will develop participants' ability to have another perspective when confronted with a situation, learn from others' experiences and apply learnt content during social interactions. Students will work together with their EU peers to create project products; this will promote active learning, will provide more comfort and open-mindedness when interacting with EU citizens.

We believe that peer learning is an underused resource, especially in our times when students seem to be one step ahead of us.

As educators, it is our duty to reduce the gap generation because we should keep up the pace with the new trends and our Ss' needs.

This project should be funded because it uses an innovative approach to the peer-to-peer learning topic using the digital tools and direct interaction with peers from different countries. Gathering participants with a different social and cultural background, engaging them in activities that stimulates the social and educational value of European cultural heritage will foster social inclusion and group cohesion, values which are promoted by the ET 2020.

The project main aim is to boost social competences in terms of social, emotional and cognitive skills among 450 students from 5 European countries during a 24 months project.

The objectives we are looking to achieve are:

- -to raise awareness about social competences among students from 5 EU schools
- -to support students social adaptation during 2 years project
- -to encourage peer to peer learning
- -to foster the students' integration in a globalized world

The connection between the objectives and the priorities we have selected can be seen in the fact that allocated distinct activities that address the Horizontal priority: Social and educational value of European cultural heritage, its contribution to job creation, economic growth and social cohesion. How are the planned activities going to lead to achievement of the project's objectives?

The activities will be integrated in the programme of 5 international reunions, 4 of them being meetings with students. The project activities are based on peer to peer learning and cooperative learning approach. When designing the project and its activities we followed the line how students think, feel and grow.

Every activity is designed to contribute making our students understanding that we are all people, that diversity is one of the beauties of humankind and mutual support will make all of us flourish turning us into better people.

The activities will lead to achieve the project main aim as we are going to use a step by step approach. Students will be exposed to other points of view in dealing with a certain topic, which will increase their cognitive skills. Their social skills will be developed during cultural activities, team work and sharing their experiences.

Students' personal development occurs in a predictable sequence, but each student has his/her own unique timeline. - -110 teachers
- -80 students and 44 teachers from all partner schools will directly attend the project mobilities
- -15 school staff (librarian, accountant, psychologist/ school counselor)
- -120 families
- -50 representatives of the local communities

Head teacher, project contact person and language teacher will form the implementation project team in all partner institutions. They will create the call for recruiting participants and make it public at the institution level.

In all partner school there are students who face learning difficulties, cultural differences and economic obstacles. They will receive support to get fully engaged in the project activities as intend to promote social inclusion, improve their life skills and develop tolerance. The school psychologists / counselors will help at this stage and help in engaging these participants in the planned activities. In all partner schools are students who come from working class families and from families with an immigration background. Some students feel rejected from extra-scholar activities, like school trips or cultural activities that might help to improve the grey environment they live in as they come from families with a low or average income.

There are students who lack motivation for career prospects and who are overburdened trying to cope with the requirements of the national curriculum and the constant changes made in the educational system. We have planned several activities that foster peer to peer education. Direct participants will help their mates to get an understanding about the project topics and share their real life experiences.

These participants will get guidance in writing their motivational letters and preparing for the preselection interview. Activities at the project club, local cultural workshops, open days events, and all project related activities that involves the presence and contribution to indirect participants are open to each and every student of our schools.

Please describe the tasks and responsibilities of each partner school. Explain how you will ensure sound management of the project and good cooperation and communication between partners during project implementation.

As changes are unpredictable, we found our management strategy on an adaptive project framework supporting cooperation and reciprocal help. All partners will host a LTTA meeting and are responsible for tasks according to their expertise and preferences.

Partners' past experience in international school cooperation and Erasmus projects will facilitate a smooth interaction among partners. The Italian coordinator will create a common list of emails of each partner's list of people involved in the implementation of the project, encourage partners to communicate via social media channels and organize video conferences each month or as often as needed. The Italian school is leading Erasmus + for the province of Trapani, which has been carrying out the EsaBac Project (double Italian / French diploma) for a few years and which pursues CLIL teaching in three foreign languages (English, French, Spanish) this aspect will help in disseminating, promoting and ensuring our project sustainability. At the level of the partnership, the main coordinator, Rosa Maria Giacalone has experience in running and coordinating strategic partnerships and is familiar with necessary documents needed to have at the project's portfolios, documents that help to track the flow of the project. She will upload information on the Erasmus dissemination platform, will design the project's questionnaires, evaluation forms, create the project common page, eTwinning project together with the Portuguese partner, and the e-guide: Practical example to support peer to peer learning.

How did you choose the project partners? Does your project involve schools that have never participated in a Strategic Partnership? If yes, please explain how more experienced schools can support less experienced partners during the project.

When choosing the project partners, a set of criteria was considered: to reunite institutions that work with students of same age, that are confronted with situations when students' low motivation for studies is affecting the learning process, schools interested in social inclusion and in fostering teachers-students-families connection and partners interested in peer-to-peer learning. Partners were asked to fill in a document replying to a series of questions meant to know the potential and contribution to the project of each partner. After the pre-selection of the partners, online discussions took place to get to know partners better. A whatsapp group was created to exchange visions about how to design the activities. Some changes were made until deciding the final list of partners. The lead coordinator launched a call looking for project partners on eTwinning and social media groups. Thanks to eTwinning one partner was selected, Portugal. This partners experience in methodologies such as "Peer Tutoring" and in providing courses for Project Based Learning, was a strong reason to select them as partners. Thanks to this partner's network of contacts we found the Turkish partner. This partner has experience in running eTwinning projects and obtained the etwinning European Quality Label for their projects. Also, their practical experience in the peer learning was a key aspect in selecting them as partners. The Turkish partner runs the D-teens project (Doga teens at discussion) to reunite students for sharing their ideas to the community of their school students.

The Greek and Polish partner were identified via social media, Facebook. The Greek partner school's philosophy is to build a school culture that is open to the collective responsibility as a structural element of school life, introducing creativity in everyday school practice and scientific and pedagogical innovation.

The Polish partner's experience in the "outside-school learning" through participating in different outdoor activities like school trips and excursions, orienteering courses, military camps and environmental project was considered as a valuable asset to our partnership.

The partners from Italy, Portugal, Turkey and Greece have experience in Erasmus Strategic Partnerships, while the Polish partner does not. As the ratio is 4:1 we are positive that the Polish partner will feel comfortable in dealing with the project. We are going to organize project meetings in the partner countries with experience so by the time the Polish team will host, they would have gained the necessary knowledge and skills in planning a project meetings.

The coordinator will encourage communication and partners will remain active in the Erasmus group on whatsapp. Monthly conferences will be held via the eTwinning project page.

How are you going to assess if the project's objectives have been met?

As main coordinator institution, we will ensure that all partners will carry out and complete the tasks as per the projected objectives to reach our final result.

We are going to monitor our project development in order to make sure that by the end of the project all objectives would be met.

All partners will delegate at least two people from the project team who will observe, monitor and measure the impact of the project. They will create a file which will be presented to the each national project coordinator each 3 months.
