We needed to get to the restaurant at 7 o'clock.

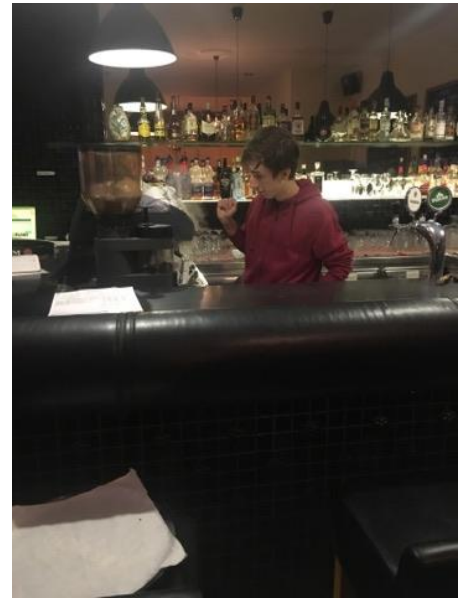
After we arrived, we needed to sort the tables out. The restaurant opens after that.

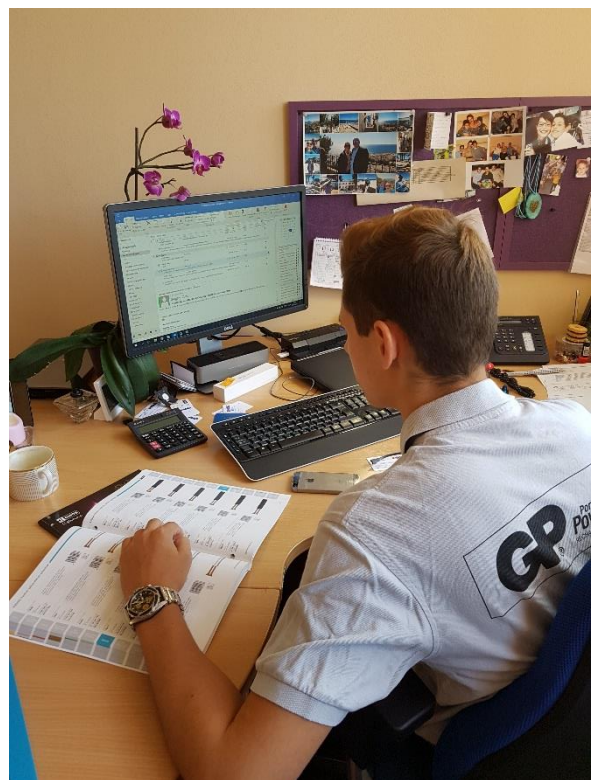

My name is Viki, I'm 16 years old and I worked at my parent's workplace in the summer.

I helped a lot to my parents in our family's dressmaker's salon. We have an undertaking where we produce swimsuits, bikinis, swimming shorts, swimming cap and many other kinds of swimsuits.

The work starts at 8.00 every day and end at 5.00. This work is about cutting, sewing and being very creative, and accurate as well, because you have to count. If you don't measure well, you can spoil the swimsuit, what's more you waste fabric and you have to do it again. At first I had to prepare the fabric then drawing the cutting plan of the swimsuit on the fabric, after this I had to roll down the fabric then sounds funny but the material has to rest. Then I cut the drawings and I prepared the accessories for it, then I sewed them. But the use of the sewing machines is specified. First you have to use the interlock then the rubberizing machine after this you have to cover the rubber bands and in the end you have to use the latching machine.

At first sight I thought that this work is kind of easy, but day by day I started to be tired a little bit both physically and mentally because I had to pay great attention to all processes.

I learned how to use a sewing machine, I developed my maths my creativity and with my help the work went faster. When I saw the swimsuits in the end I realized that it is worth the effort.

And finally there is a picture about me with my fellow helpers (I am the one with red-yellow T-Shirt and with light long hair) :



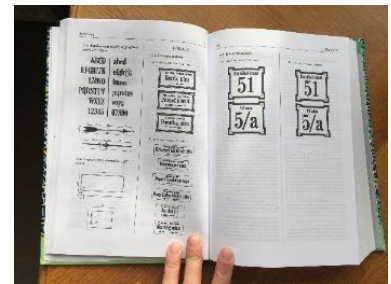
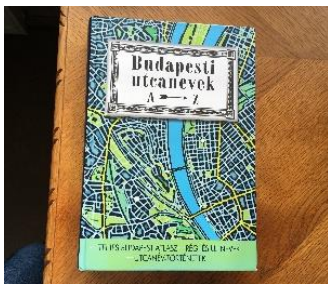

MY JOB SHADOWING DOING LAYOUT OF STREET SIGNS

My name is Marci and I show you my uncle's job. He works at a company that produces, places, and distributes the street signs. The company is in contractual relationship with Budapest and rural governments. The next diary will show the creation of the street signs. Firstly, notifications arrive to the Budapest or rural department of urban management of the local government, if for example on a certain corner there is a deficient, felt down, or damaged street sign. If more notification arrived for a certain place, then the local government forward it to the company where he works. Sometimes it is preferred to check these notifications, that's why he goes to the scene, collects the data, and document the deficient or status of the street sign.



After the checking he aggregates the datas in an excel chart where all of the important informations are stated that have to appear on the new street signs (number and name of district, name of the city and the street's house numbers). After preparing of the excel chart he sends it to his colleague who creates the graphic art of the street signs. After this the street signs are produced and has a specified size, 70x30 cm.



The created street signs go to a storage in Budapest. Then the signs will be placed to the right corner. These street signs can be placed on a fence, on a wall of a house, or on a street sign pillar. Mostly, so that there is no danger of accidents, approximately 2 meters high and well visible. If the street sign is on the right place the workflow ends.



This company deals not only with street signs, they create more kinds of signs, for example information, or guiding plate.

Hi! My name is Netti. This is my job shadowing diary:



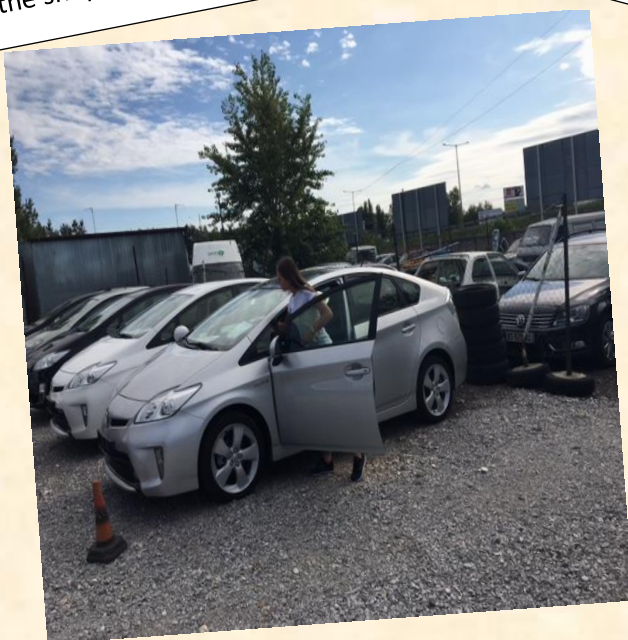

They have treated me normally, they did help and assist every time in my job when I couldn't find the proper cleaning products, they helped me a lot to learn how to maintain everything in the shop.

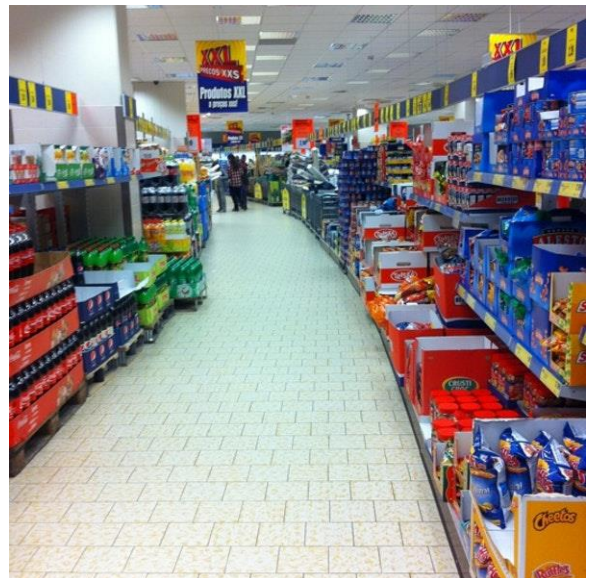
There was a dedicated supervisor who was controlling my work. This lady was a real professional, she was in charge of the environment of the shop there. I had a lot of compliments from her.

12:30 - 15 pm: continue burnishing work



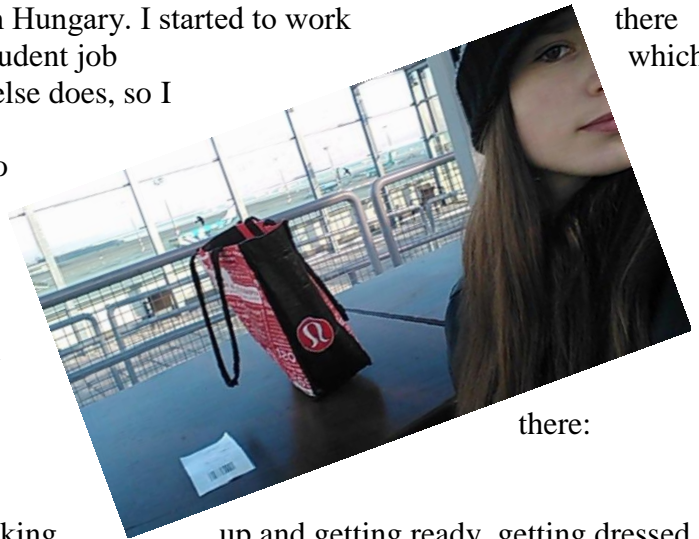
15 pm: finish work and go home and prepare for the next day

6:00 am – Waking up and getting ready, getting dressed. We have a dress code of course as it is very important to look „professionally” when you're working at the airport even if you're just a simple student worker. So I put on my white shirt, black jeans, black coat and black boots in the autumn and winter time. When it's summer we can wear skirts obviously.

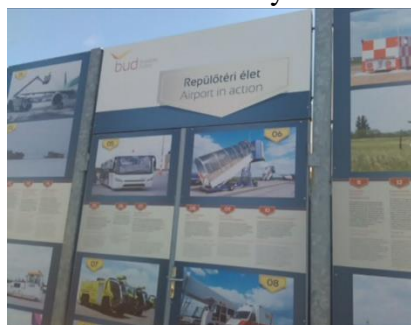
6:30am – Getting on the bus which takes me to the airport.

8:00am – The day starts.

First, I have to sign myself up so my bosses know when I arrived, and then when I finish I also have to write the time I left to the diary. It's important because if I don't do that I won't get

my salary. I usually work with another student because there are two terminals, but lately I've been working alone which is sometimes a bit difficult, especially when so many tourists come. So what I have to do?



My job is kind of easy, only the people that makes it difficult. I have to stand next to the taxis and the ticket seller and show the people which taxi is theirs. They have to buy a ticket first which has a long number on it and they have to show me the number so I can lead them to their taxis because each taxi has a number on its front. 
sign myself up so my

Usually the non-English speakers don't know what they have to do with their tickets and when I ask them to show me their ticket number politely as how I supposed to do they don't understand and start talking in their own language with me, which I obviously don't understand. So in this case I still don't know what to do, I try my best to make them understand and tell them somehow in other languages but it almost never worked since I work there so I usually just call my boss.

And of course there are the angry, impatient ones who have no reason to be angry at me but they still are and even if I want to speak up for myself I have to remain calm and polite because that's my job. I would say these are the absolute disadvantages of my job.

But of course there are many advantages about it too, and many nice tourists.



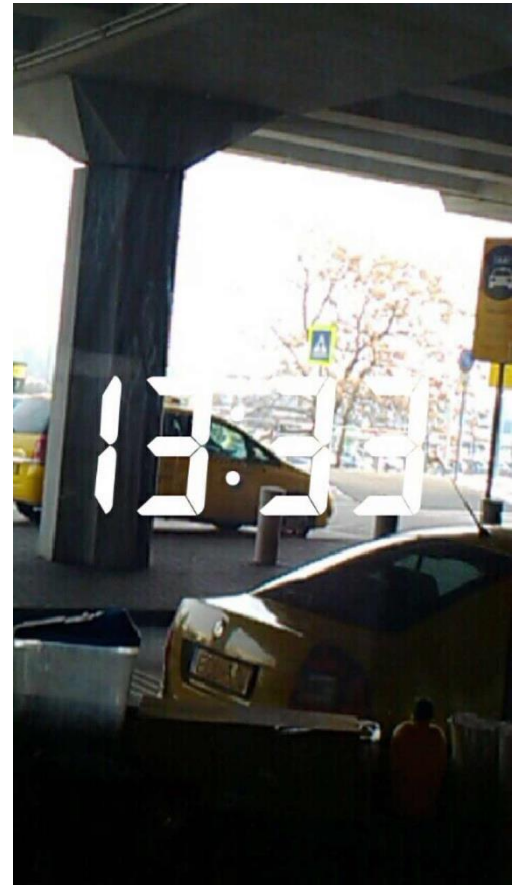
Sometimes my bosses give me a huge board with a name on it and send me inside the terminal, I usually just have to stand there with the board and wait for the person whose name's on it. I usually don't have any breaks during the 8 hours I'm working, but I can take a break whenever nobody comes to buy a taxi ticket, I'm allowed to do anything as long as I do my job when it's needed.

Sometimes I work at night, which I definitely love more but then I arrive at home at around 11pm usually, but for me it's still better than waking up in the early morning.

All in all, I love my job, and I hope I can continue to do it for a very long time!



Job shadowing and working as an interpreter

My name is Fu Yi Ping. I'm nineteen years old. I've been working in a interpreter group for two years.

When I was fifteen years old, I joined the interpreter group of the biggest local Chinese newspaper office in Budapest. I usually work in different business conference as an interpreter. And now, I'll show you how interpreter's work looks like.

8:00 I arrived at the office, and signed in at the sign in machine.

8:15 I had to check out the basic information of the business conference which will be held at afternoon and also sort them out.

9:30 I took apart in the work conversation we usually had before every single case with my boss and the other interpreters. We had to go through the specific process of the business conference, define the different role in the division of labor to cooperate, and the solution of unexpected situations etc. And then I got my work permit card!



12:00 Last check, and go to the place where the conference will be in. (It's usually at Four Seasons Hotel.)



13:00 Meet the clients, introduce myself, talk with them, try to get to know them more , answer their questions ,and of course selfie!



14:00 After the conference had begun. I have to note and translate every single word of my client to two languages: Chinese and Hungarian.



16:00 After the conference, I had to wait until all of our clients had left and then make a short summarize with my colleagues. At the end, I have to give my work permit card back before I. leave the place.
