Cultural Heritage is an expression of the ways of living developed by a community and passed on from generation to generation, including customs, practices, places, objects, artistic expressions and values. Cultural heritage includes [tangible culture](#), things that you can see (such as buildings, monuments, landscapes, books, works of art, and artefacts), [intangible](#) culture, things that are invisible (such as folklore, traditions, language, and knowledge), and natural heritage (including culturally significant landscapes, and biodiversity)
