City of Lights is a non-profit making project led by a voluntary group of artists, organisations (including The Works Dance & Theatre Cornwall, Kernow Education Arts Partnership, Truro School of Samba, Cornwall Music Service, Truro City Council, Event Cornwall and Devon & Cornwall Police) and freelance practitioners.

Truro's colourful City of Lights parade sees around 30,000 people descend on the city for the vibrant parade of 600 imaginative and awe-inspiring lanterns, created by local schools, business and community members, accompanied by infectious samba rhythms from at least 100 musicians and dancers, and an array of street food and drink.
