BELÉM TOWER

Alto Douro Vinhateiro is an area of northeastern Portugal with more than 26 thousand hectares, classified by UNESCO as a World Heritage Site, in the category of cultural landscape. Surrounded by mountains that give particular climatic characteristics and bathed by the Douro River, it is part of the so-called Douro Wine Region, an area where wine has been produced for over 2000 years, including the world famous Oporto wine.





The Torre de Belém, officially Torre de São Vicente, is a fortification, located in Lisbon, on the Tagus River, which served as a watchtower and medieval defense, where artillery pieces were available.
