Foreword:

This project started in September 2018 and it will last in June 2020. Six participating schools from Czech Republic, Turkey, Finland, Spain, Cyprus and Italy have been working and will work on tasks connected with the topic of the project.

Six meetings are scheduled for the period of 2018 - 2020:

1st meeting in FINLAND, December, 13-18, 2018 2nd meeting in CYPRUS, January, 23-28, 2019 3rd meeting in ITALY, March 31- April 5, 2019 4th meeting in TURKEY, October 11-16, 2019 5th meeting in CZECH REPUBLIC, 28.February - 4.March, 2020 6th meeting in SPAIN, April 2-7, 2020

Priorities;

HORIZONTAL: Social and educational value of European cultural heritage

HORIZONTAL: Development of relevant and high-quality skills and competences

SCHOOL EDUCATION: Promoting the acquisition of skills and competences

The partners are going to share the responsibilites and tasks. Six topics and six tasks were divided among all the partners according to their choice. Each school will take over the responsibility of one of the topics and one of the tasks and thus the project work will be balanced and each school will be involved in the work equally.

The partners agreed on the following distribution of the topics (1), tasks (2) and workshops (3):

CZECH REPUBLIC - 1. Music and dance, 2. website, 3. "Living in Erasmus+ world"

ITALY - 1. Traditional cuisine, 2. brochure, 3. "Share the food"

FINLAND - 1. Folk stories, narrations and theatre, 2. facebook page and group, 3. "United in diversity"

SPAIN - 1. Language and its changes, 2. video and photo-documentation, 3. "In or out"

CYPRUS - 1. People (immigration, emigration, movement of people), 2. e-Twinning, 3. "Next generation"

TURKEY - 1. Life in villages and towns, crafts, jobs, 2. newsletters, 3. "Breaking stereotypes"

ALL PARTNERS - Games of our ancestors

The project includes both local activities and mobilities (learning/teaching/training activities). The activities focus on roots and cultural heritage and include topics such as: life in the past, folk stories, music and dance, migration, cuisine or language. During the workshops we will also deal with several European issues.

In this project we are going to achieve the following objectives and concrete results:

- 1. Development of competences of the participants of the project (communication and language, cultural awareness, creative, digital, social, analytical, and moving)
- 2. Printed outputs Book of stories, a brochure about the project, a photobook, newsletters, promotional materials
- 3. Online outputs web, facebook page, e-Twinning, e-magazines, logo
- 4. Development of international cooperation in the partner schools and strengthening the cooperation of the schools with municipalities, libraries, community centres and houses of culture at the local level
- 5. Breaking stereotypes about other cultures, traditions and lifestyles
- 6. Extending the knowledge of the partner countries in the field of history, traditions, customs, ways of life, and geography
- 7. Extending (or gaining) the knowledge about various UNESCO sites.
- 8. Development of friendship with students and colleagues from partner schools
- 9. Development of awareness of the European Union issues including Erasmus+ programme
- 10. Exchange of good practices and methods of work with young people

The participants are students aged 14-19 from six countries from various parts of Europe, from various cultural, social, geographical background, their headmasters, teachers, other school staff and parents. We are going to involve public into our activities, too, particularly responsible people from municipalities, libraries, community centres.

In the activity "Interview with older people" and creating "Book of stories" old people will be involved to share their life experience. Each school will involve at least 30-50 participants in local activities and 15 students in mobilities.

During the activites we will use various methods of work - presentations, workshops, discussions and debates, interviews, excursions, seminars, lectures, role-play activities, intercultural activities etc. We are going to use methods of both formal and informal education.

The project will have a desired impact on the participating schools, it will help to start or extend their international partnerships and activities, the schools will be more popular for next newcomers and public will learn more about school activities. People not connected with schools so far can learn about the school activities and maybe find some kind of cooperation. The students and teachers of the partner schools will improve their skills and will become more interesting for the labour market.

Motivation of the students and teachers for future international cooperation will increase and the awareness about Erasmus+ programme and other matters regarding the European Union will be enlarged.

The project will help the participants to become aware of the roots, history, traditions and cultural heritage of their country and to overcome prejudices and stereotypes about other cultures.

This is an important fact particularly in countries where anti-European forces are getting stronger and in the times when Europe looks back to its roots.

The project will bring a long-time benefit for the schools, some of the materals, presentations, Book of stories as well as some methods of work can be used in the future and involved in a curriculum.

The schools will also strengthen cooperation with municipalities, libraries or community centres and will be also able to offer future students the gained experience.

And above all, the participants will gain and develop their competences and will become more educated, more cultural and more interesting for labour market.

Now,let's have a look at what the students and teachers from all participating schools have done since September 2018 until today. Here are the short introductions of the partner schools and their activities so far:

The tasks, activities and preparations;

We had a general meeting for all the school community, teachers, students and parents. The headmaster Mr. Birol Orak gave a seminer about Erasmus+ programme and the project on September, 18th. Then, the school Erasmus+ group was established and started to work on the project tasks and activities.





- * To carry out a survey on Traditional life in villages and towns, crafts, jobs by interviewing their parents and grandparents and also old people in their neighbourhood for the book of stories. İsmail Çağrı Çiydem and Nisa Begüm Aladağ took the responsibility of preparing this task.
- * Presentation of the project posters on "How we see each other" was taken by Nisa Nur Tezcan and Berker Çetinkaya.
- * In September, the responsible students, Sude Taşkın and Berker Çetinkaya went to Antalya museum, Sandland museum, Suna-İnan Kıraç museum in order to obtain the entrance permissions and also to have seminers given about the traditional crafts and jobs.
- * The responsible students, Ege Arda Yücebaşar and Barkın Sabah went to some villages in order to find a village to accept our group so that we could show the real traditional life in villages to our guests. After their research, they agreed with the muhtar (local mayor) of Karaveliler village which is 30 km away from the Antalya city to join a traditional village wedding and dinner.
- * In early October, the responsible students, İlayda Arıkan and Fatma Sıla Yılmaz organized the "Games of Ancestors" workshop, made some drawings in the school garden.
- * Our responsible students, Sila Topalkara and Dilek Ceren Özyıldırım prepared the presentation of video on "Traditional life and towns, crafts, jobs in villages".
- * The responsible students, Sude Erden and Meriç Erel had interviews with the mayor of Muratpaşa District and also the directors of Termessos Ancient place in order to arrange an official visit to the mayor and a permission to the exhibition of life in the past in villages at Termessos Ancient place.
- * Ahmet Mert Mutlu and Sude Akıncı were the responsible students with ICT.
- * Sude Taşkın and Sıla Sena Ertaş were the responsible students to organize the whole events, share the responsibilities, check the tasks, result them, put all the docs and presentations in to the Book of Stories, eTwinning, etc.

After we completed all our tasks and activities, we had a two hour simulation of the programme on Oct.4th. We checked and corrected the missing parts, added new parts. We sent the finished programme to the project coordinator in order to get the approval on Oct.4th.

After all these preparations, we were ready to host the 4th meeting of our project with all the students group, host families, teachers and school administration.

THE PROGRAMME:

11 October

We showed our presentations and watched others. We had lunch at school. At the school hall, we had the "ErasmusDays" events, exhibition and "How Do We See Each Other" profect posters. After school, we went to seaside, Beach Park and tasted some traditioanal Turkish foods. We walked around the city. It was a very entertaining evening.







12 October

We had a city tour: Antalya Museum, Sandland, visited the city, learned about the history of Antalya/ Turkey. Also we saw the Old Town Festival, Suna Kıraç Museum and we did some shopping. We were given a small seminer about the traditional crafts and jobs at Suna Inan Kıraç Museum by an expert. We ate lunch in Kaleiçi, hanged out there and then in the evening, we departed to "Karaveliler village" to join a traditional village life, dinner and a wedding ceremony. We learned so much about the traditional Turkish life in this village. We, as Turkish students, taught some traditional dances to our guests.



13 October

This was a whole day excursion to Phaselis, Üçağız Village, Rock graves of Myra and St. Nicholas. This was also a very unique excursion to teach our past history to our guests. Our friends tasted and had Turkish kebap and then we climbed Mount Chimera in the evening.





14 October

The day started with visiting the mayor of Muratpaşa town ant the town hall. In the afterneoon, we came back to the school and started the preparations for the National Cuisine Day. And finally it was time to show cuisine! Each country presented their cuisines which they brought with them from their countries. Turkish students prepared a food from Turkish cuisine. So, we also introduced our traditional dishes



15 October

This was the day to present our traditional life in villages, crafts, and jobs presentations. We visited the Termessos ancient city and partner countries showed their presentations about traditional life in vilages, crafts and jobs at the conference center of Termessos ancient city.





16 October

Partner countries presented their roleplays about the Breaking Stereotypes. This was really very enjoyable moments of the projects because we were able to see and break some prejudices towards us. All of the students attended lessons with Turkish students. In the evening, we went to EXPO center to have the diner and closing ceremony. After the ceremony, everyone was sad because it was our last night together. Time to say goodbye. We hugged each other and went home.





17 October

Day of departure. We had breakfast at the seaside with other students and we took our friends to their teachers who were waiting for them at their hotel.





Dissemination;

* After the fourth mobility in Antalya, we updated our project noticeboard in the school with the new photos and materials. We also uploaded the new materials, photos and presentations into the eTwinning page of the project.

On Oct. 23rd, we prepared a presentation and a seminer at school in order that we could share and disseminate our experience with other students, teachers and parents at our school.

May: In the first week of the month, the responsible person of the project, Mariacristina Nobile, together with an English teacher, Anna Chiarenza, started the project work. Selection criteria of choosing a student to take part of the project were based on their good competences in the English language and their real motivation to partecipate. To disseminate the information about the project, a seminar was carried out and its topics and aims were illustrated.

We had a board meeting with the students to discuss the project and the preparations for the upcoming experience in Turkey. They were given information about the activities focused on roots and cultural heritage in order to develop students' competences in cultural awareness, traditions, way of life, and ancestors lifestyle.



June: Students were given information about their accommodation in host families, the means of transport, the weather, the flight schedule and a co-responsibility agreement was established.

September: According to the peculiarities of the project, the teachers and students started their work preparing a video about the traditional jobs and crafts. Students interviewed local employers to get information about the ancient roots of their work and their motivations in carrying on their family traditions.

They indeed drew and colored posters about "breaking stereotypes" in order to overcome prejudices about foreign countries and different cultures.



October: In the first week of October, students were invited to a computer room to answer some questions about the advantages and disadvantages of living in a small village and their answers were elaborated in google form in order to have a pie chart.

On October 11th, we were welcomed in Antalya and we were introduced to the Turkish education system and the school. We attended the presentation of questionnaire results "Life in Villages and town, crafts, jobs" from six European Countries.

In the following days, we visited and learned about the Turkish culture. For example, we saw the Ucagiz village, Rock graves of Myra and Demre Ancient Theatre.

The last day was very hard, especially for students, because they developed new friendships and shared a positive experience while in Turkey.

My Experience in Turkey

I often reminise about my experience in Turkey. It is one of the most amazing opportunities I have ever had in my life. Before leaving, I was very nervous and had no idea what to expect, because I was heading to a different country, filled with people I have never met.



The school year started in mid-August and we welcomed 115 new students to our school. All students were informed about our Erasmus+ Roots project in the principal's welcome speech. Soon after the school year started, we took up the activities to be prepared for our meeting in Antalya, Turkey. The team had been selected before the summer vacation and the students had already started communication with our hosts during the summer.

The Roots team collaborated in the autumn with the drama course students and this resulted in two excellent videos about the stereotypes we have about our neighboring countries Sweden and Russia and this was carried out as a roleplay of two ice hockey teams.

The dissemination of the results of the project was carried out on 26 October 2019 in a conference where all the teachers from six different upper secondary schools of the region took part. In addition, after the project meeting in Antalya, Turkey the participants gave a morning assembly to our school about their experiences of the trip. A photo show was also on display in the teachers' room.

In January we had an open night for all 9th grade pupils and their parents. We presented all different aspects of our school including our Erasmus+ Roots project. Viivi Anttila and Miiro Toissalo told about their experiences in Roots and about their trip to Catania, Italy.



The Roots team had five workshops where students and teachers worked on the common topics. Students were given responsibility for carrying out their projects and evaluating the outcomes. The workshops consisted of brainstorming and giving feedback and the actual work was done in students' free time independently. This method gave the students a possibility to practice self-determination and organizational skills.

On the 17th of September we had a meeting with all the students taking part in the project and they were informed about their upcoming tasks.

On the **20**th **of September** the Headmistress of the school, Mrs. Maria Kyriakou-Polydorou and the project coordinator Marina Georgiadou had a meeting with the parents of the students travelling to Turkey (4th mobility) to inform them about all the details of the trip.

At the **end of September**, the team of students taking part in the 4th mobility began preparing the presentations about crafts and traditional life in villages, a role-play and a poster about breaking stereotypes. They interviewed old people trying to find out how life was in the past.

On the 10th of October the Cypriot team traveled to Antalya-Turkey. They stayed there until the 17th of October and had a really great time.

Disseminations activities:

At the **end of October**, part of the Erasmus team prepared a board at the hall of the School where they presented photos of the previous mobilities.

During the **last days of October**, the project coordinator informed all the students of the 1st grade about the European program Erasmus+ in general. What is the aim, who can take part in it, what are the benefits of taking part in these programs, etc. She also presented to them, the current program of school "Roots", they learned about the project context, aims, partners and mobilities.

On the **27**th **of November** the coordinator of the project, Marina Georgiadou attended a seminar held by the **National Agency** in Cyprus, about the use of the Mobility Tool+ and the Erasmus+ Project Results Platform.

On the 4th of December the coordinator of the project Marina Georgiadou attended a seminar/workshop, offered in collaboration with Future Worlds Center, a Cyprus based NGO which is a partner in the project MigratED - Migrations and human rights enhanced through Technology in Education, funded under the Erasmus+ Programme of the European Commission. "Refugees, Migrants: pedagogical approach" which was organized by the UNHCR and the Pedagogical Institute of Cyprus.



Students painted pictures from ancient monuments (cultural heritage) of Cyprus and the **new calendar** 2019-20 of the school was issued at the end of December.





Winter feasts presentation

Students worked on a power point presentation about the winter feasts in Cyprus. It was uploaded on our e twinning portal.







Surprisingly, they discovered that, before Halloween feast reached our country, in many places of our area, there were very similar traditions. Unfortunately, those traditions have beenlost but our students were able to find very interesting testimonies of people who still can remember them.

This is what Amaia San Martin 's grandmother told us about it:

"I remember that 60-70 years ago my granmother and grandfather told me that they used to "steal" the pumpkins from other people's gardens in a funny way, and they also had the chance to go out at night to celebrate Arimen Jaia or Soul Feast. Unfortunately, those tradditions disappeared during Franco's dictatorship"

On the other hand, during **December**, our teachers and coordinator focused on spreading information about our previous mobilities. They met students who are interested in taking part in the next year's project. Students asked different questions and our coordinator and teachers involved in our project, try to answer all of them. now we have a group of students ready to take part in the next Erasmus+ project.

CZECH REPUBLIC: FITH STEP IN OUR PROJECT

Right **before Christmas**, our Erasmus + coordinator and the Headmaster held a meeting with the three students who are going to take part in the next mobility. Parents also attended the meeting.
