








Suomenlinna Fortress Island



Suomenlinna Fortress Island

- is one of Finland's seven UNESCO World Heritage Sites
- was built in 1748 when Finland was still part of Sweden
 - Russians continued to build it after taking over Finland in 1809
- it takes 10 minutes by ferry to get there from central Helsinki
- is a very popular tourist attraction and picnic area
- has a supermarket, a school, a rescue station and an open prison
- has around 800 residents living there


