- In the morning from 9.30 to 13.00 the Erasmus team discussed about the mobility which will take place in Romania from the $12^{\text {th }}$ of May until the $18^{\text {th }}$.
- We discussed on the program of the mobility.

## On Tuesday (Orientation in Space and Time)

- 9.00-9.30: Students and teachers will go to the hill. There, they will talk about the surroundings of the town.
- Students will calculate the distance.
- They will discuss about the temperature: Celsius-Fahrenheit.
- Each country has to prepare the students as far as the place they live, the meteorological phenomena and the climate.
- 13.30: Lunch in a pension nearby.
- Afternoon: Adventure Park (arrangements are to be made).


## On Wednesday (What do I eat?)

- 9.30-11.00: Go to the supermarket and to the city market.
- There the students will be asked to concentrate on certain types of food (cheese, salami, yogurt, biscuits, soda, ice cream, sweets).
- They will focus on the ingredients.
- They will select which is the healthiest and which is the less healthy.
- 11.00-11.30: Coffee break.
- 11.30-13.30: Funny experiments in the Chemistry lab.
- 13.30-14.30: Lunch.

- 16:00-17:00: guided tour to the city centre


## Thursday

- In the morning: planetarium short presentation of the planets of the solar system in English.
- Students will work in teams and they will be involved in a series of calculations, concerning the distances of the planets from the Sun or the Earth.
- Visit of the University's library.
- Lunch at the University Canteen.
- Afternoon: Visit to the botanical garden: Students will play games concerning common spices of each country.

## Friday

It will be an e-book created by the students which will include pictures, impressions and emotions from their visit. The e-book will be connected to the subject under investigation which is dyscalculia.

In addition, towards the end of the meeting the team discussed the ages of the students involved to the mobilities and it was agreed that the group of students will be from 14 to 17 years old.
