


Ulysses

The cave of Polyphemus

- Legend says that in Milazzo there is the cave of Polyphemus, the one of the Cyclops, where he was blinded by Odysseus and his companions



The sea stacks of the Cyclops

- Polyphemus, blinded by Odysseus, come out of his cave and cast huge rocks towards the sea in order to hit the boat of Odysseus. In the gulf of Acitrezza, near Catania, there are spectacular sea stacks



Aeolian island

- Aeolus, the god of the winds, gave hospitality to Odysseus and his companions. On the day of the departure, he gave them a bag containing all winds, to be used to return home. But the companions of Ulysses opened the bag unleashing a terrible storm. That brought them back to the island of the god. Today the aeolus island are dream tourist destination



Odysseus and the sirens

- The sirens are beautiful but deadly. They sit beside the ocean, combing their long golden hair and singing to passing sailors. But anyone who hears their song is bewitched by its sweetness, and they are drawn to that island like iron to a magnet. And their ship smashes upon rocks as sharp ad spears.
