

- Flag of the Czech Republic consists of our national colours (tricolor) - white, red and blue.
- Czech State Emblem consists of two Czech lions, one red and white Moravia eagle and one black Silesia eagle

- The Czech republic lies in the heart of Europe, in the central Europe.
- Czechoslovakia was established in 1918, and on 1st January 1993
 Czechoslovakia was split into two separate countries: Czech
 Republic and Slovakia
- Neighbouring countries are Poland, Germany, Austria and Slovakia

- The CR is also divided into three counties: Bohemia, Moravia and Silesia.




BASIC INFORMATION




The current Czech president Miloš Zeman

BRNO






- Brno is the second largest city in the Czech Republic, it is situated in the Moravian region
