



Erasmus+ Christmas tree

On 14th December 2020, all our students in compulsory secondary education and basic vocational training participated in a collaborative simultaneous activity which gave rise to a special type of Christmas tree.

During the first two periods of class, each group of secondary education investigated about the different types of heritage in the different countries-partners in the Erasmus+ project "Heritage for development".

Once photographs of different examples of heritage were selected, the students of vocational training were in charge of teaching younger students how to make the special Christmas balls for the decoration of our Christmas tree. Its structure was built by a small group of pupils coordinated by their Arts teacher. For that, they used some wood that they had collected from the surroundings of our school some days before.

After every student had identified his/her work of heritage and the country where it belonged, our students of vocational training decorated our Erasmus+ Christmas tree with more than 120 Christmas balls containing different examples of heritage in Spain, Poland, Turkey, Italy and Greece.

This activity meant an organizational challenge since it involved about twenty teachers and more than 100 students working at the same time in the creation of a common final product. Moreover, our students were developing their digital competence as well as their artistic skills.
