<p>Nerca</p> <p>Maria Luz Morales Godoy was a pioneer journalist in 20th century Spanish cultural journalism and writer. She was the first woman in Spain to be the director of a national newspaper, (La Vanguardia) which she directed between 1936 and 1937 at the beginning of the Spanish Civil War. This woman is important because she received the Order of Academic Palms award in 1956 from the French government in recognition of her work. My opinion is that she is a very hard working woman and has been a very important woman in the history of Spain since she is a pioneer of cultural journalism.</p> 	<p>Carmen</p> <p>Tarkan Saylan is a Turkish dermatologist, academic, writer, teacher and social activist. Her best work was for her fight against leprosy and for founding the charity organization. My opinion is that she is a very hard-working woman with many achievements thanks to her efforts.</p> 	<p>Zofia Kosak-Szczucka</p> <p>Born in Kraków in 1899, she was an activist, but also a writer. She created 2 organizations during WW2 especially designed to help Jews escape the Holocaust. My opinion is that she was brave because when she was told her father died.</p> 	<p>Angel</p> <p>Matilde Di Canossa. She became famous because she was Duchess and Margrave. She was born in 1045 and suffered at a young age the death of her father. My opinion is that she was brave because when she was told her father died.</p> 	<p>Miguel F</p> <p>Eleftheria Arvanitaki. Greek singer whose crystal clear voice has made her especially famous inside and outside of Greece. Some of her hits, such as "Dimitri", "Omo kaitaki" and "Parapono / I senilia" are well known in Spain. My opinion is that she was brave because when she was told her father died.</p>

<p>Sahika Erdem</p> <p>Yeni Yasas (Turkey)</p> <p>She is a spokeswoman in a Turkish newspaper and world record holder for <i>Fastlane</i>. Born on January 16, 1991 in Trabzon, she was educated at Gazi Primary School and received a secondary education at 30222 Pinyon American Secondary School in her hometown and this woman also cares about the planet in the ocean. That's why in my opinion she is a great woman.</p> 	<p>Clara Campoamor - Carla Fuentes (Spain)</p> <p>Campoamor a member of parliament in 1933, was responsible for a historic achievement in Spanish history, achieving for the first time, universal suffrage after she talked in Congress with Victoria Kent, who believed that the vote of women should be proportional until greater emancipation of the husband.</p> 	<p>Maria Curie- Maria Beronca (Poland)</p> <p>She was a Polish physicist and chemist who conducted pioneering research on radioactivity, as the first of the Curie family. In 1903, she was the first woman to win a Nobel Prize, the first and the only woman to win the Nobel Prize twice and the only person to win the Nobel Prize in two scientific fields. She was the first woman to become a professor at the University of Paris in 1906.</p> 	<p>Alisa Papiriga - Ela Acosta (Greece)</p> <p>Politicist, human rights lawyer, born between 1991 and 2007. She was the first woman in the Communist Party of Greece, being the first woman to hold that position. My opinion is that she was brave because when she was told her father died.</p> 	<p>Tapputi-Belakhalim</p> <p>Leide Maria Morge (Greece)</p> <p>She was the first chemist of the history. She was born in 1200 B.C. Tapputi-Belakhalim worked in perfume factory she used flowers, oil, myrrh, opium and balsam. She used the first distillation system. My opinion is that she was brave because when she was told her father died.</p> 	<p>FEM by students in 2ºESO</p> <p>FEDERICA MONTSENY (Spain)</p> <p>Federica Montseny has been a politician, novelist, book author, poet and essayist.</p> 	<p>Emilia Pardo Bazan - Paula Freg (Spain)</p> <p>Emilia Pardo Bazan took advantage of her aristocratic and noble position to demand a necessary change in the face of educational inequality between men and women, introduced literary naturalism in Spain and brought, through her work and her actions, the main ideas of feminism of the time.</p> 	<p>Irene Sendereva - Miguel Demich (Poland)</p> <p>She was one of the main actresses during World War II. This remarkable woman created the first program and saved more than 2,500 Jewish children by taking them out of the Warsaw ghetto. My personal opinion on this woman is very good because she is a heroine of many moments.</p> 	<p>ASPASIA Álvaro Figueras Salgado-Greece</p> <p>Aspasia was certainly the most famous of Greek women. She was a friend of Socrates and very famous for her knowledge. The most important politicians, artists and philosophers engaged her company. He also as philosopher and poet. She was a teacher of Plato; he had a great influence on the cultural and political life of Athens. My personal opinion is that she is a hard-working woman.</p> 
<p>Matilde Di Canossa - Lorena Cañón - Italy</p> <p>She was the greatest ally of Pope Gregory the sixth and also ruled northern Italy for a long time. My opinion is that everyone can govern well and she stands out for her way of governing. She also stands out for unconventionally defending the Pope, being the only one who defied him. Matilde was born around the year 1045 into a powerful Italian family with strong Christian beliefs. Daughter of Boniface III of Tuscany and his wife Beatrice of Lombardy, Matilde received a careful education in her own</p> 	<p>Spain</p> <p>DOMINI: ELENA MARAZZI (1853-1900)</p> <p>Elena Marazzi was the first woman to graduate from a medical school.</p> 	<p>Haki Kamal Alberto Bello (Turkey)</p> <p>Haki Kamal was a Turkish archaeologist and painter. He played a key role in understanding Hittite hieroglyphs (discovering a tablet with a Hittite calendar) and in preserving Turkey's cultural heritage through his restoration. My opinion is that she was brave because when she was told her father died.</p> 	<p>Mariana Pineda - Elias Hurtado (Spain)</p> <p>Mariana Pineda was Spanish activist, this was the mother of two young children. Mariana she was imprisoned for having collaborated the legend "San Liberty Equality" in a flag and anthem of Belgium she was chosen Deputy of the Assembly National of Turkey. She was tried and sentenced to death. My personal opinion, Mariana was a very brave woman making a banner that said "Liberty, Freedom and equality" and she should not have died because of all her efforts of oppression.</p> 	<p>Halide Edip Advar - Atayeva</p> <p>She is a writer that defends human rights she was the first graduate in American college. In 1906 he was condemned to death through European capital, she was chosen Deputy of the Assembly National of Turkey.</p> 	<p>CONCEPCION ARENAL - Hugo M (Spain)</p> <p>Concepcion Arenal is a Spanish feminist, journalist, poet and Spanish feminist writer.
