HOW TO USE THE INTERNET SAFELY



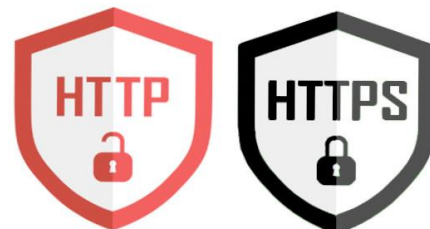
Use programs like Adblock, or similar. They will protect you from unwanted ads.



Don't send strangers photos. You don't know where they will really end up.



Respect others in the network.



Use safe internet websites.



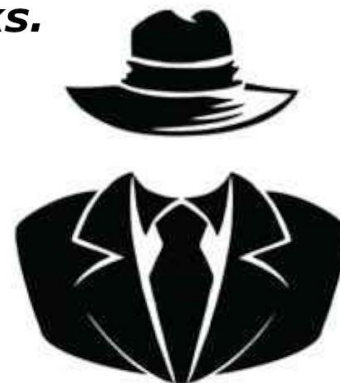
Protect your privacy.



Don't click on suspicious links.



Never post private information about you.



Don't believe or trust strangers who you meet on the internet.

How can we distinguish between authentic and fake news?

1. Check the source - always check the web address of the webpage
2. Develop a Critical Mind-set – a lot of fake news is written to create "shock value"



3. Has anyone else picked up on the story? What do other sources say about it?



4. Check That it "Sounds Right" - use your common sense!
