

He was born in Genoa on 6th October 1931.

He is an Italian astrophysicist, today naturalized American.

He was awarded a share of the Nobel Prize in Physics together with Raymond Davis Jr. and Masatoshi Koshiba in 2002 for his astrophysics researches which led to the discovery of the first cosmic x-ray sources.

His name has been given to an asteroid called:

«3371 Giacconi».




Renato Dulbecco


He was born in Catanzaro on the 22nd February 1914, but he lived and studied in Imperia.

He did most of his researches in the U.S.A.

Thanks to his studies and researches about the interaction between tumour viruses and the genetic material of the cell, he obtained the Nobel Prize for Medicine and Physiology in 1975.

He was born in Genoa on the 12th October 1896, he studied languages and literature frequenting as self-taught the city libraries.

He was a poet and a prose writer, in his poems he described the landscape of Liguria comparing it to the human soul.

He won the Nobel Prize in Literature in 1975.


Giulio Natta

He was born in Porto Maurizio (IM) on the 26th February 1903.

He took his degree in chemical engineering in Milan when he was very young.

He stayed there as director of the Institute of General Chemistry of Pavia University. There he started his researches which led him to the discovery of the "isotactic polymer", the light plastic which revolutionised the production of the modern world objects.

In 1963 he won the Nobel prize in Chemistry with Karl Zieger.
