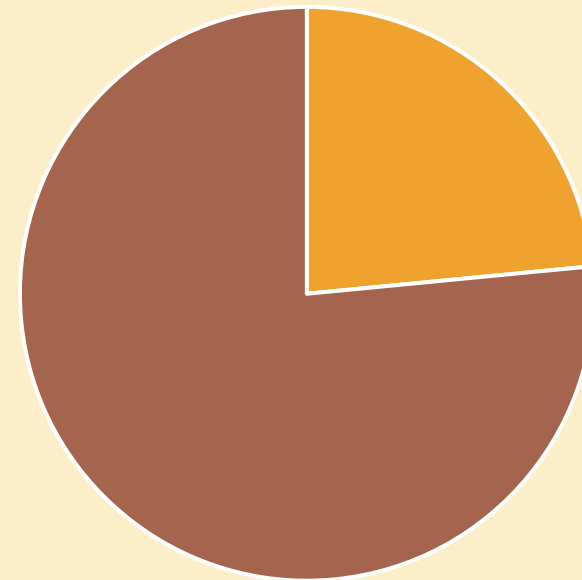

Should the Oscar categories for best actor and best actress become a single one?

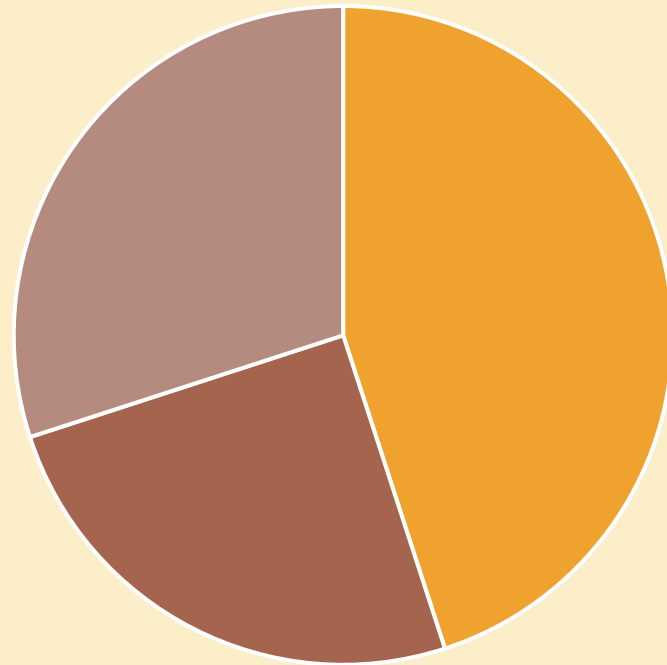
- Only about a quarter of the people said yes
- People who answered no said that they prefer more prizes to be given; this doesn't appear to be rooted in sexism or prejudice.

■ none ■ 1 ■ more than 1

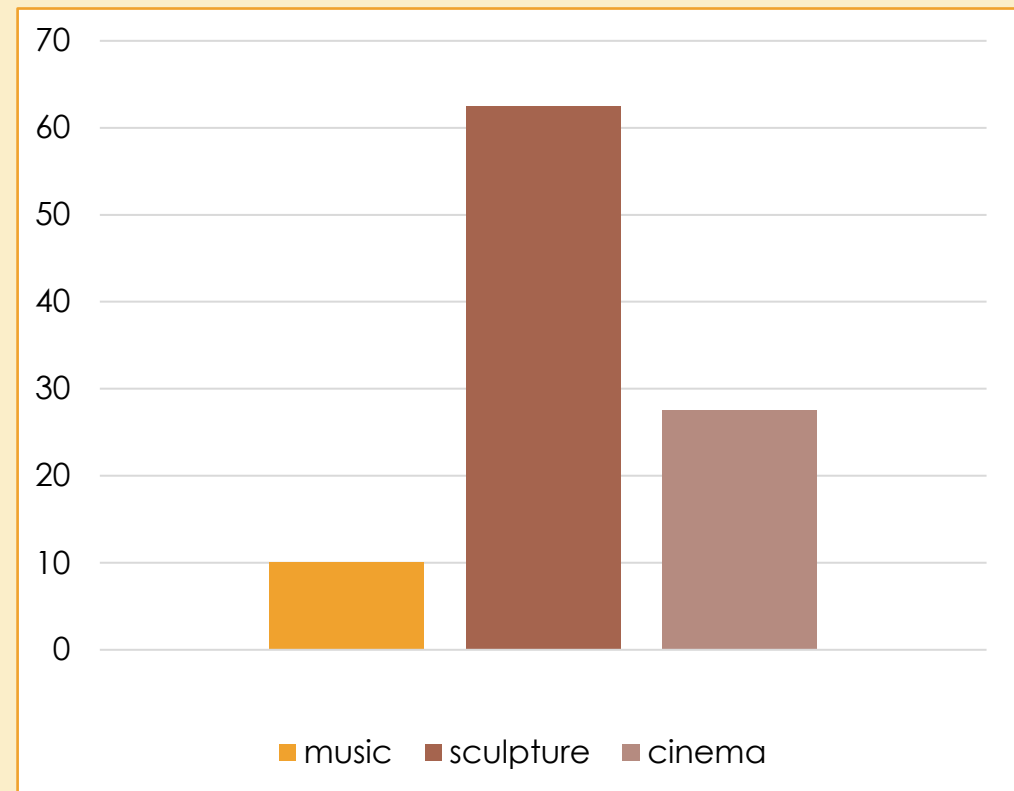
- The most popular answer was Frida Khalo, followed by Georgia O'Keefe, which shows that women have become famous painters only in recent times
- Still most of the people only knew one female artist and 45% couldn't name any



In which field is the biggest difference between women and men?

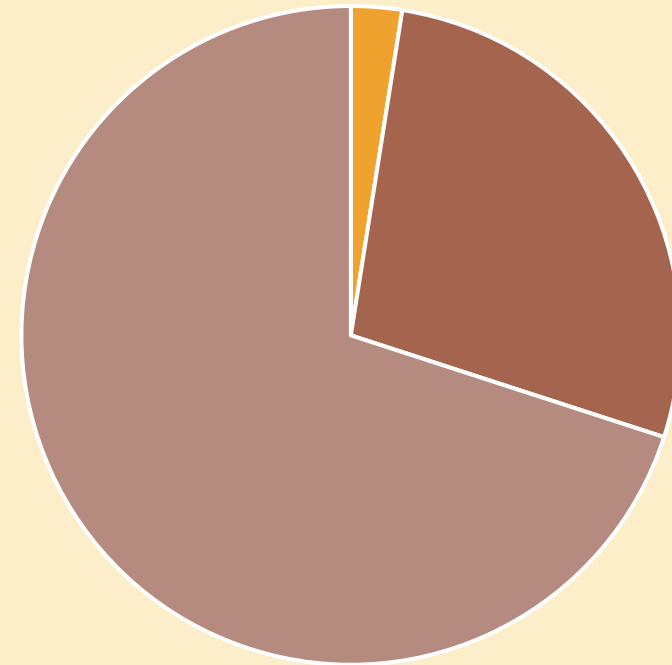


- Most people felt that in the music industry there are equal opportunities for men and women
- Regarding cinema, women don't have as many opportunities to play main characters as men, and there are very few women directors
- Most people couldn't name a woman sculptor



In the books you read, the hero is more often:

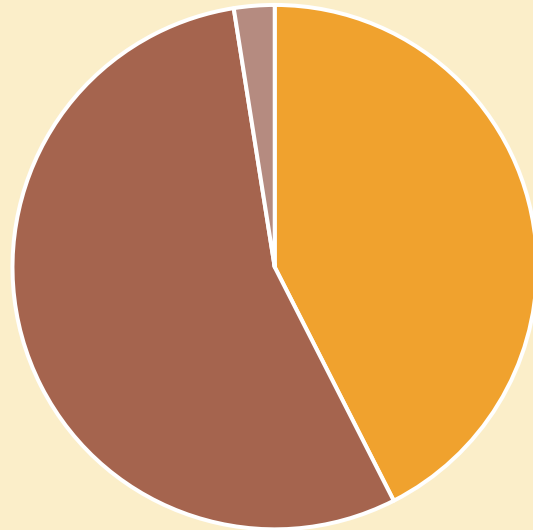
- Most of the people that answered the survey read books where the main protagonist was the same gender as them (ex. most boys read more books with boy protagonists and viceversa)
- However, statistically most books have a male protagonist.

- This belief comes from the stereotype that women have an inclination towards arts, humanities and culture
- Girls are expected to do better in school than boys and have an all-around better general knowledge





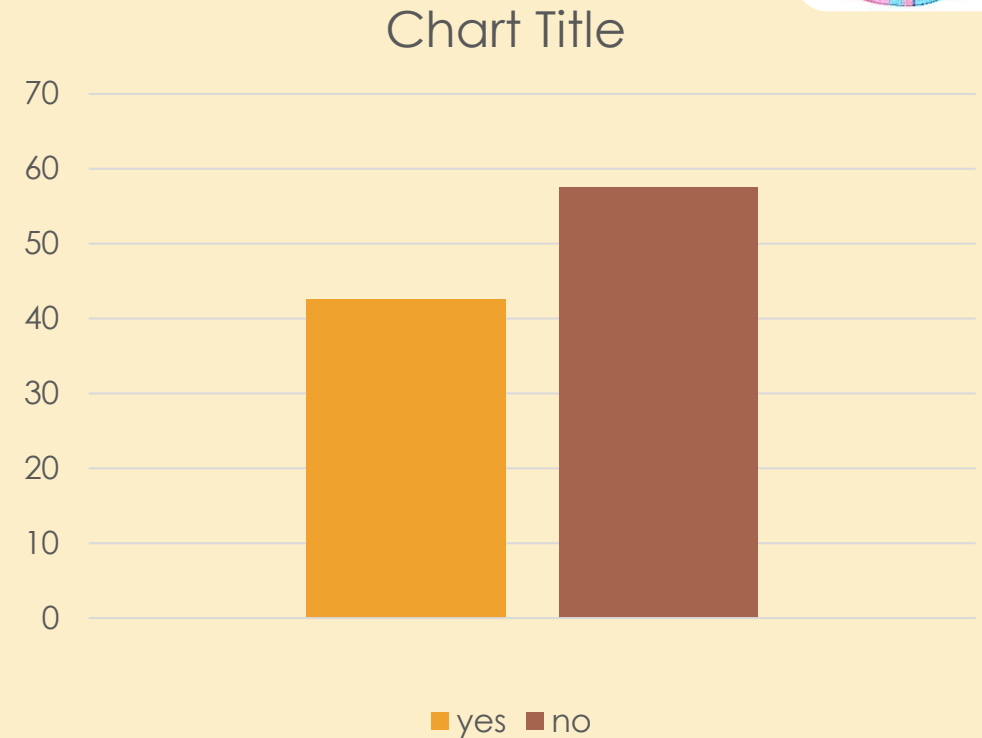

Have you ever experienced difficulties at a sport event because of your gender?

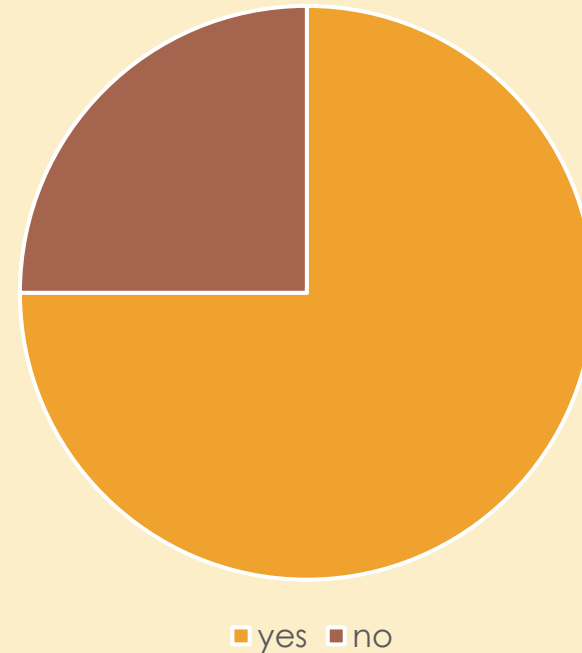


- 75% of girls answered yes
- The experiences they had were both while playing and while watching a sport live or on tv
- 90% of the girls who had bad experiences reported it was men/boys who tried to make them feel inferior
- Boys mainly received mean comments while practicing/watching a female-dominated sport (dancing, ice skating, gymnastics)



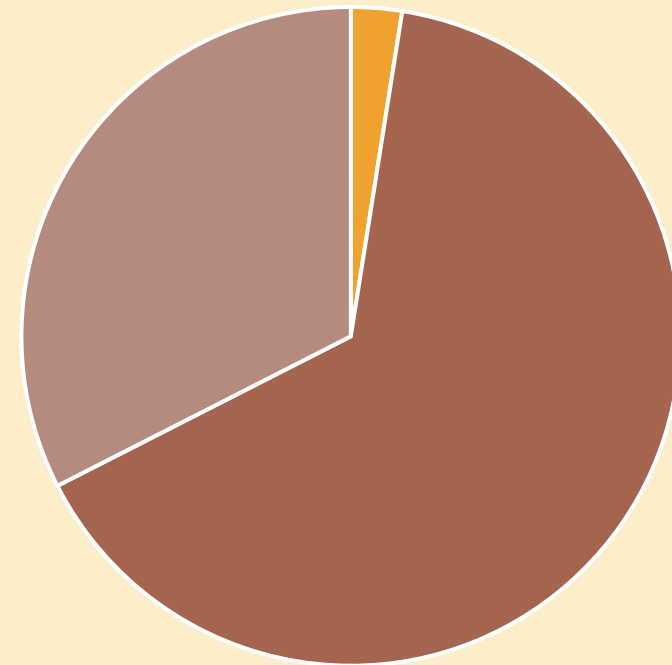
Do you think gender-specific genetics determine if a person can be good at a sport?

- All people who answered no were women, however some women also answered yes
- According to science there are some differences between men and women but they aren't relevant for professionally trained athletes



According to you, how often is female sport shown on tv?

- Only one person believed that women's sports have too much tv coverage
- 80% of girls and 50% of boys would like to see more women's sports on tv, mostly tennis, gymnastics and football.



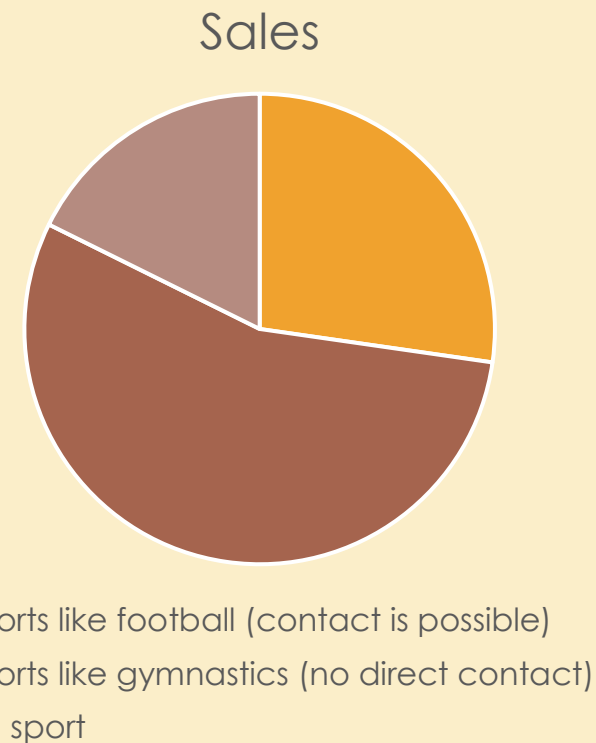
too much too little enough



Which sports should have mixed teams?



- The majority of boys and girls said that non-contact should have mixed teams
- Only some girls said they would not mind playing more dangerous sports alongside boys
- This could be explained by 2 stereotypes: that girls are more “fragile” and that boys are more violent and dangerous



Who would you prefer as a coach?

- 65% of respondents said they would prefer a woman coach
- Girls reported they would feel safer with a woman coach, while boys thought a woman coach will be more patient and gentle
