Fort du Petit Bé

Contributed to the protection of the city, classified as a historical monument in 1921. It can be visited at low tide.



Grand Bé

Or Grand Bey, is an uninhabited island, it can be reached on foot from Bon-Secours beach. Chateaubriand (writer) is buried there.



Cézembre

It is an uninhabited island, there is only one restaurant open in summer. She is 9.5 hectares.

Le grand aquarium

First of all, there is the great aquarium which is located at the entrance of the corsair city of Saint-Malo.

You can see 11,000 marine animals and 600 different species.

On average, 360,000 people visit the aquarium every year, making it one of the most visited private tourist facilities in Brittany.
