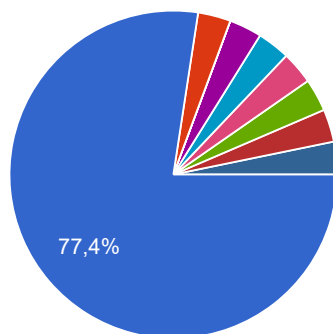

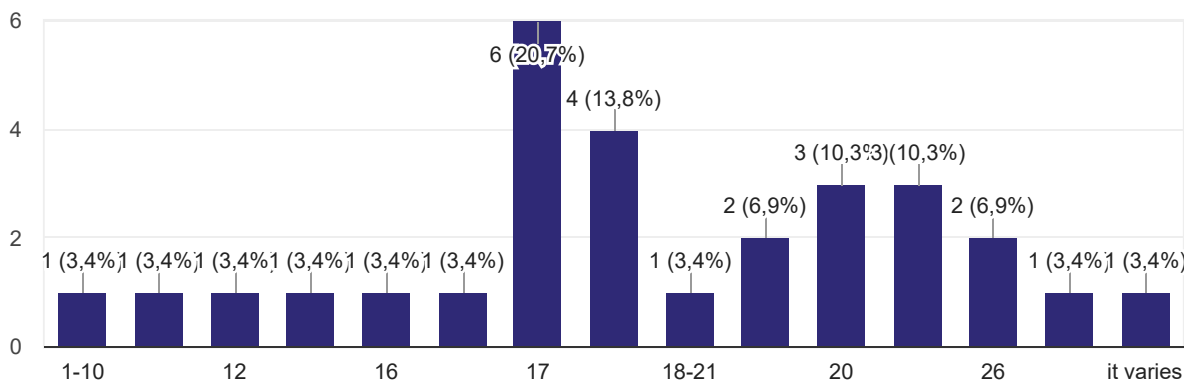

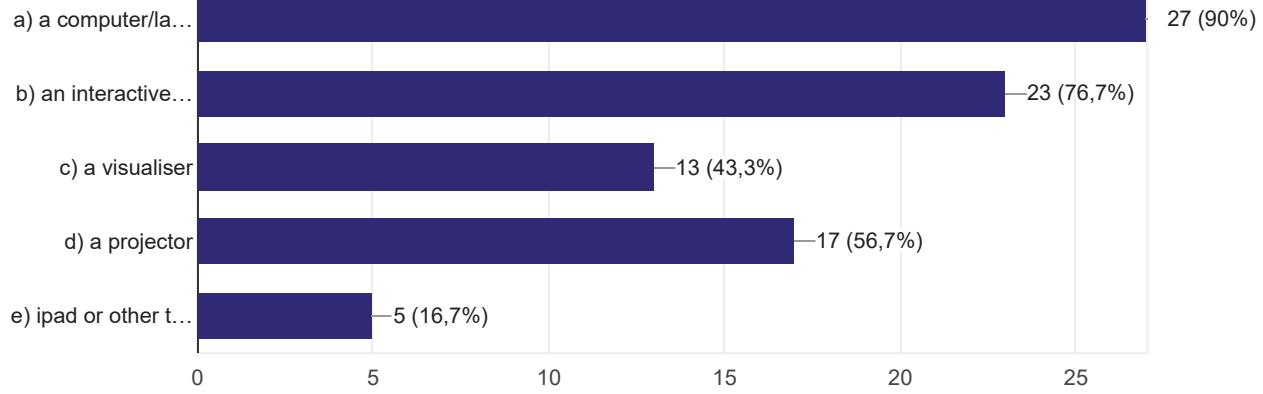

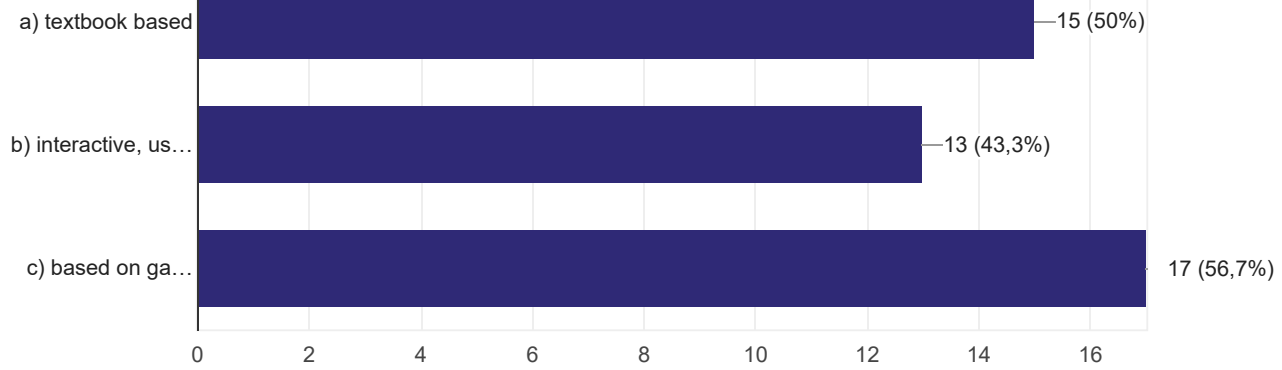
5. Which of these do you use in your teaching, on a daily basis?

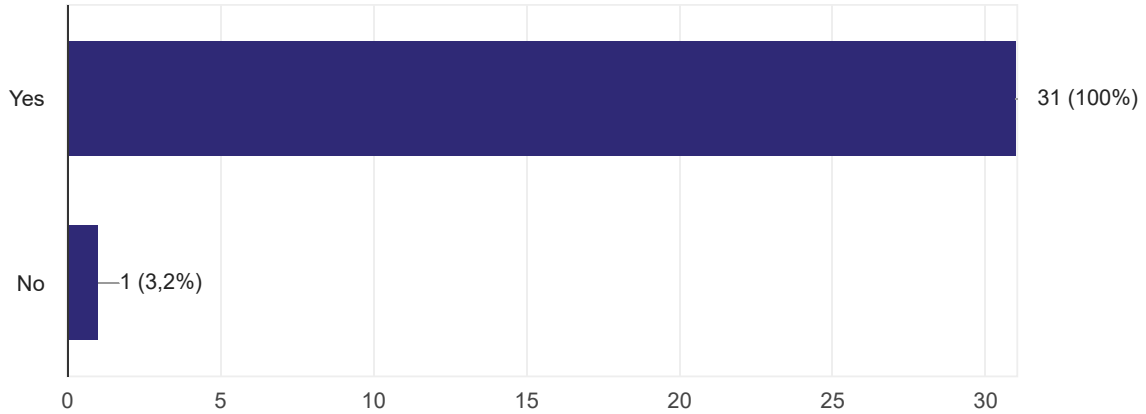
6. Is your teaching mainly

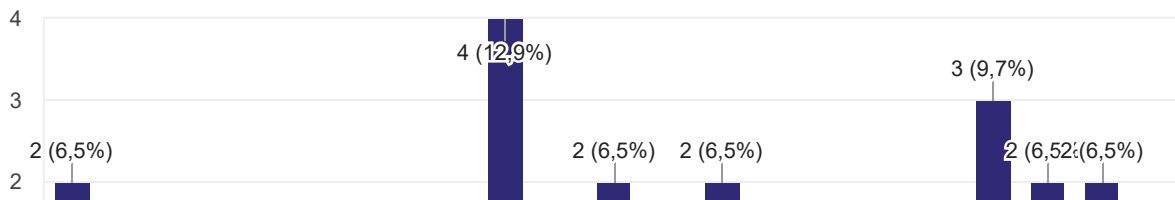
7. Are any languages taught in your school?

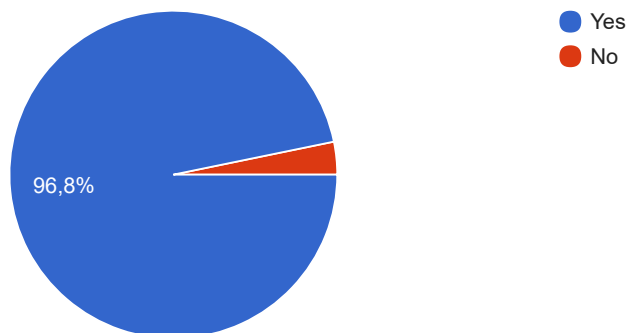

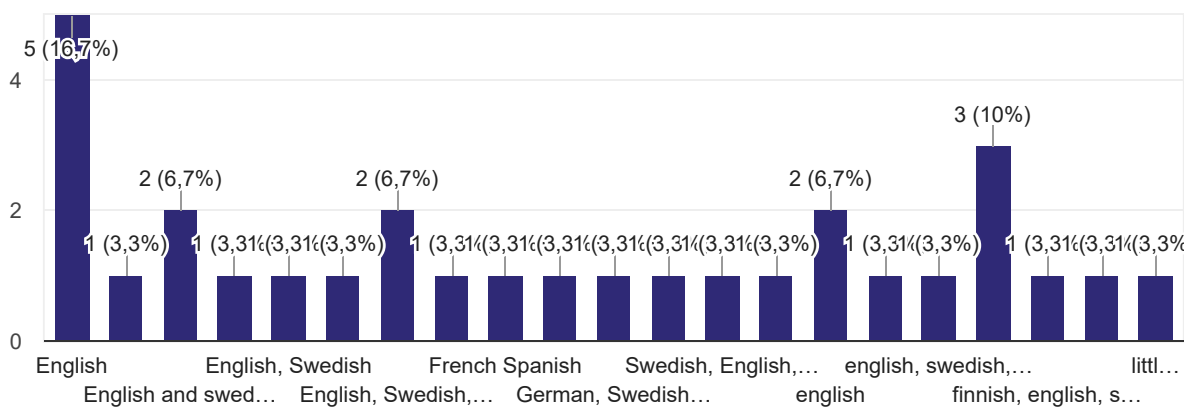

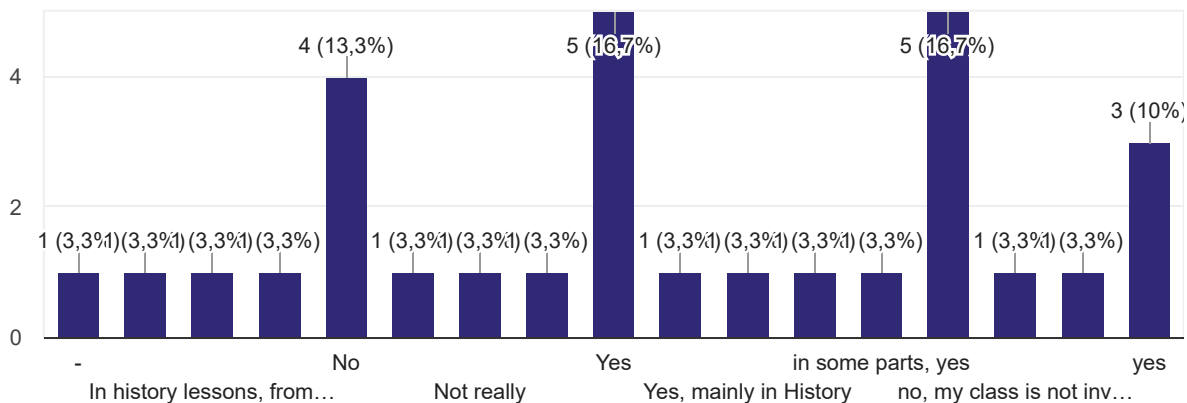
