# Reasons for social exclusion

## Financial problems

- unemployment,
- poverty
- lack of means to live (homelessness)
- uneven(different) division income

## Social problem

Diversified and uneven access to:

- education,
- integration,
- promotion
- prosperity

## Political and cultural problem

- limited participation in decision-making processes and political life
- diversity in language, culture and religion


# 1. What does your school do to prevent exclusion?

## Results:


The majority of students - 76.9% think that there is an advisor in the school or trustworthy person who is the source of help,


in the second place are one-off activities (visits, talks by experts , etc.) or participation in volunteer programs that help people in need.

- This graph shows that it is very important, both at school and at home. Operation in accordance with a special procedure is not effective in comparison to the other opportunities.






- Differences of gender (male-female)

**We can see that each value with the highest notes is different, which shows the lack of the leading factor and it shows that there are many serious factors that affect social exclusion.**




- Loneliness and depression

# 5. Which reactions did you see in cases of discrimination at school?



**As we can see, people are running away from the problems of others, according to 70% of people who look only at themselves and their own needs. Many people would like to help, but they do not know how to counteract this problem. Only 23% indicated help for a discriminated person.**
