Gino Strada (on 21 April 1948) is an Italian war surgeon and founder of the UN-recognized Italian NGO Emergency.

He worked with the International Committee of the Red Cross (ICRC) in the conflict zones of Pakistan, Ethiopia, Peru, Afghanistan, Somalia and Bosnia.

 Emergency is a humanitarian NGO that provides free medical treatment to the victims of war, poverty and landmines. it helps civilian victims of **EMERGENCY** war without being hindered by bureaucracy.



• In 1996, it opened its first hospital in Iraqi Kurdistan.

Today, Emergency operates eight hospitals in areas of conflict, including a surgical hospital in Freetown, Sierra Leone, and a hospital in Lashkar Gah, Afghanistan. Fifty-four "First Aid Posts-Health Care Centers", located in heavily mined areas or close to the front lines, are connected to the Emergency hospitals' network
