One child (here, we have Victor) is responsible for it for a week.

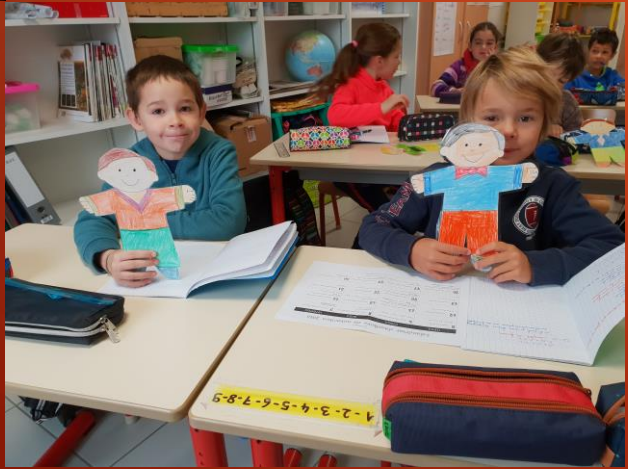
He's changing the date on the calendar.

At 9 o'clock we study until 9h45, when we have a break in the playground.



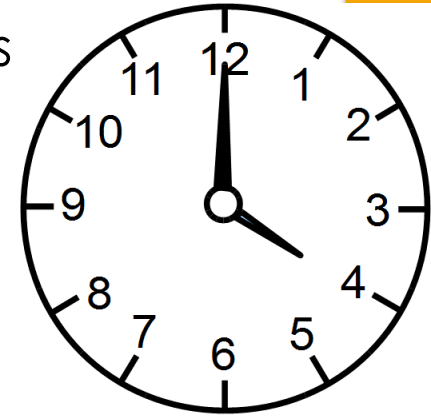
We work until 11h30, when we have a 2 hours break to lunch.



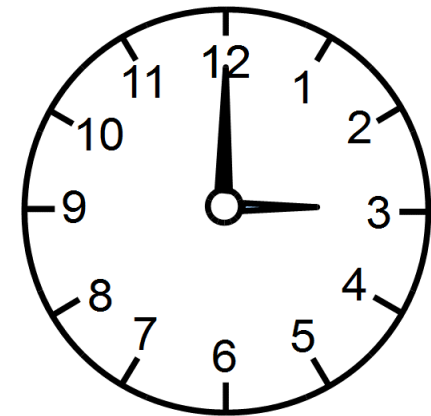
Except on Wednesdays, when we either go back home, or spend the afternoon at the school's day-care facility.

- ▶ 15h on Thursdays and Fridays

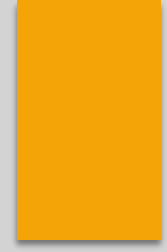


After school,
