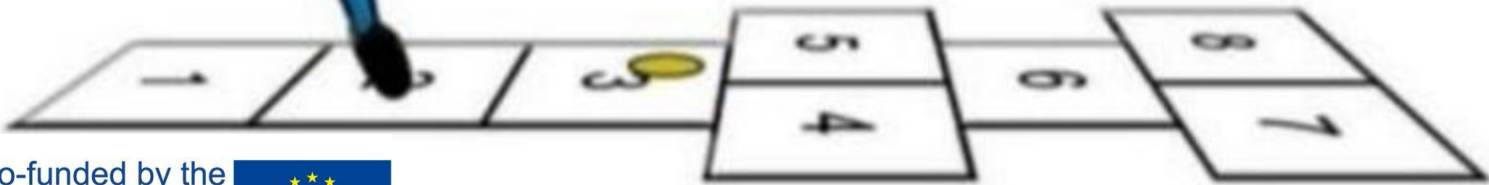

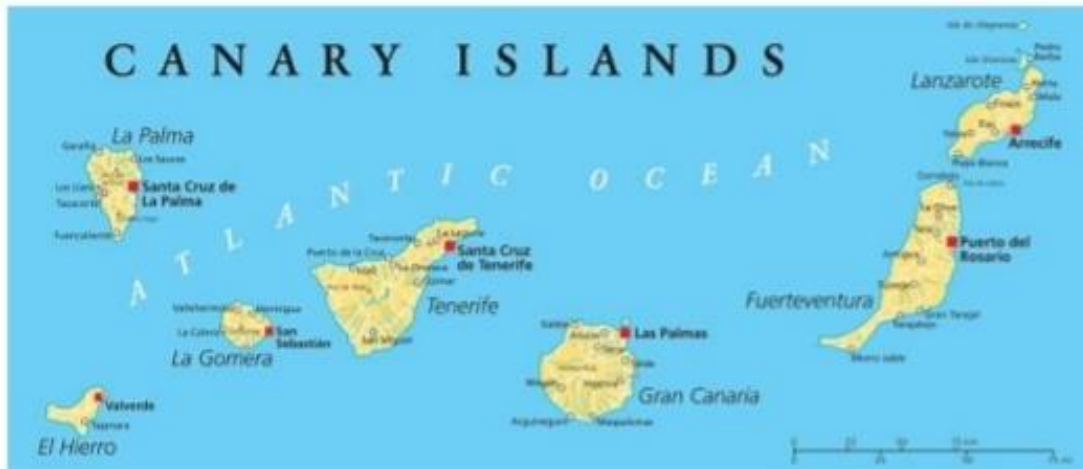

Introduction

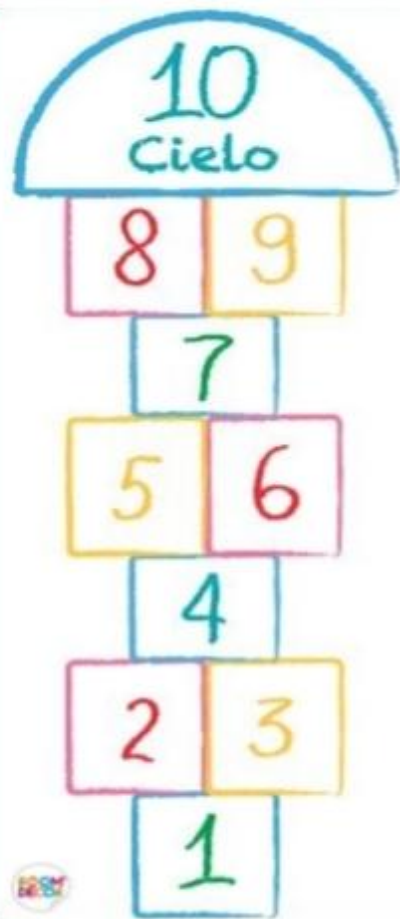
We are talking about one of the most popular games in the Canary Islands. This is a very fun game that requires skill, aim, and balance.

The Greeks played it, then the Romans continued. Since then, the game has spread throughout the world, with many variations and regional adaptations emerging at the same time.



Description

Teje or Tejo is a jump and toss game, in which several players meet and draw on the ground some boxes ordered from 1 to 10. The players will throw a flat stone (called "laja" in Canary Islands), starting with number 1. If the flat stone falls on the indicated square, you have to go jumping the squares in order on one foot, pick up the stone on the way back without putting the other foot on the ground and throw again to the next number.



RULES

1 If you fall down or step on a line, you have to start again.

2 If the stone falls out of the box, the player will lose the turn.

3 The player who finishes the trajectory before, will win.
