This game is one of the most popular traditional children's games, which was played and is still played in schoolyards or in many squares.




It is typical in the 8 Canary Islands.




DESCRIPTION

The field consists of two parts, the field of team A and that of team B. Each part has in the back, an area for the "graveyard" of the opposing team.



Divided into two groups (group A and group B), with a ball, we will try to hit members of the opposing team.



- •If someone from the other team hits you with the ball and falls to the ground, you are momentarily eliminated and you go to the graveyard part. You will have the right to follow the game from graveyard (being able to save yourself).
- •If the ball is thrown at you and you catch it without touching the ground, whoever has thrown the ball at you is momentarily eliminated and will go to their graveyard from where they can continue playing with the aim of returning to their field.
- •If someone from a graveyard hits someone from the opposing team with the ball and the ball later touches the ground, the hit person goes to graveyard (which corresponds to him) and the pitcher is saved and returns to his field.
- •It is allowed to pass the ball between the boss of a group to the graveyard of the same group, as long as the ball is not intercepted by the opposing team.
- The team that manages to put the entire opposing team in the graveyard or who has the fewest deaths in the graveyard will win.
- •If you hit someone on your team with the ball, it is not eliminated.
- •If the ball hits after bouncing on the ground, nothing will happen.
