Workshop 1 - a presentation of information by each country to all

Results of interviews / information on current **part-time jobs** in each country:
Do they have part-time jobs/ how long they work/ how much they get paid per hour/ Is it easy to find jobs/ what kind of jobs young people do etc.

Workshop 2 – a group discussion

Different pathways students can take in each school, mainly focussed on part time work but also any preparation for the World of Work in general. Possible questions to answer are:

1. How does your school support young people to get into the world of work?
2. What help do you get from teachers/careers advisers/other?
3. How is this structured? Class talks, external speakers, business partners?
4. Part time work and how our schools prepare junior and senior students for the World of Work?
5. What general skills, soft skills and hard skills/attributes are required for different types of jobs - some examples
6. Youth Unemployment statistics and reasons

We will compare and summarise in groups and then share findings/results

Panel Discussion - a representative from each country and the local business partners

Presentation/short summary of what each country does to help young people get into work and the opportunity to put questions to local business partners on what skills/attributes they are looking for in the young people they employ.
