

Do young people in Scotland have part time jobs?

Do you have a part time job?

Answered: 28 Skipped: 0



- Everyone answering the survey is a student at Peebles High School.
- 85% of respondents have a part time job
- 15% of respondents are currently unemployed

Where do young people in Peebles work?

- 60% of the people who answered the survey work in a café or a restaurant, as a waiter or kitchen staff.
- Other part time jobs included:
 - Shop Assistant
 - Dance Teacher
 - Tennis Coach
 - Working with animals


How many hours a week do young people work?

- The results were very varied
- The lowest number was 4 hours a week
- The highest was 16 hours a week
- On average, a shift lasts about 5 hours.

How much do young people in Scotland get paid per hour?

- The minimum wage in Scotland, for people under the age of 18, is £4.20. (4.75 euro)
- The minimum wage in Scotland, for 18-20 year olds, is £5.90. (6.67 euro)
- People who answered the survey earned between £4.20 an hour to £10 an hour.
- The average wage was £5.83 per hour

Why is it easy to find a job in Peebles?

- The 39% that think it is easy to find a job gave reasons for this:
 - Lots of businesses rely on part time workers
 - There is always jobs advertised
 - Peebles has a lot of local businesses that specifically look for part time workers
 - Peebles has a lot of hotels that require a lot of staff

Why is it not easy to find a job in Peebles?

The 47% that think it is not easy to find a job gave reasons for this:

- Very few jobs in rural areas and young people can't rely on poor public transport
- Some businesses only want to employ people who are over 18 years old
- There are so many young people that look for part time work; too much competition for jobs.
- Some businesses only want staff during busy periods (e.g. Christmas)
