

Erasmus+ „Work in progress – My logbook” Julia Kaluza

Friday, 24. Nov

First, we went to the auditorium. There we met all the others and built up some groups. My group called themselves the colorful balls and had members from Estonia, Italy, Finland and Germany. In these groups we played some games like angels and devils or taboo. It was a lot of fun and helped me to know the group better. Then we got our group theme: This House believes that fresh air is a human right (pro). After that I went to eat with Ella, along with some others. At 13 o'clock we all met again in front of the sports hall. Together we played table tennis, basketball and volleyball in the sports hall. First, everyone parted at the different stations and played in their morning dissolved teams the sport. At the end of the lesson everyone gathered around a ping pong table. Together we played a final round of table tennis. After physical education, I spent my time with Ella. Since we were both in a group together, we could search for information on our topic. Then we all met again in the auditorium and listened to a lecture on innovative companies that deal with the problem of particulate matter. It was about a measuring station, which is inexpensive and easily accessible for everyone. It can simply be mounted outside a building and measures particulate matter using a sensor controlled by a microcontroller. This circuit can also be supplemented by other components such as microphone or thermometer. All recorded values of the measuring station are then published on a public internet site to make this information accessible to as many people as possible. After the talk, we went home to gather first information on our topic.

Saturday, 25. Nov

We met at the bus station Nellingen and drove all together in the bus to the Daimler Museum to look at the exhibition there. The exhibition was very detailed and understandable. So, she started with the first fictional cars and finally ended up with state-of-the-art sports scales. The whole exhibition was built based on a timeline, making it comprehensible and understandable for laymen. The current topics such as exhaust emissions and particulate matter were also addressed. This was very enlightening for our arguments, so I was able to collect a lot of useful information on fresh air there. After we had all visited the museum together we drove directly into the Stuttgart city center. As a TV tower inspection on this day was badly possible due to the weather conditions. Arrived in the city center, we split into the project teams and were assigned roles. During the game we used the public transport briskly. I noticed some disadvantages. So, the transport was often not on time, especially the buses were often a



delay. Another disadvantage is the difficulty of getting to remote places. However, public transport also offered some benefits. This allowed us to travel a long distance and reach distant places. Also, the staff was very friendly and helped us to find the right way. It was also pleasant to change between the various means of transport, a change from bus to train was not a big effort for us. All in all, I was able to use the Mister X game to get a good idea of the advantages and disadvantages of the means of transport. But public transport is still not good enough to completely banish traffic from the city.

Sun, 26. Nov

Monday, 27. Nov

Very important currently was the classification of the arguments to the speakers and the formulation of these arguments.
