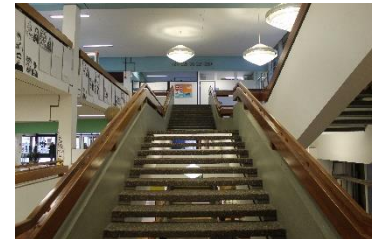


Erasmus+ “Work in progress – My logbook“

Monday, 27th November 2017

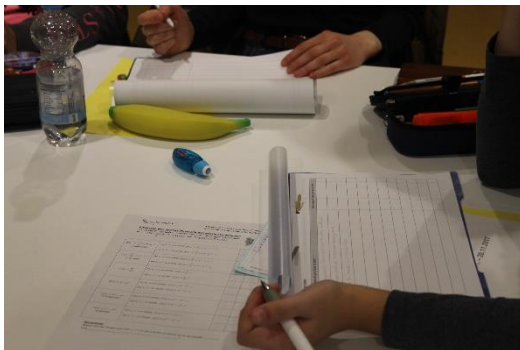

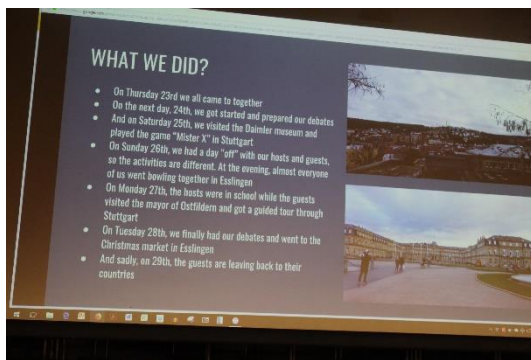
