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Wednesday, 3rd October 2018

The day started at the Stuttgart airport from which we took a plane to Frankfurt.

After a two hour stay at the airport in Frankfurt we flew to Estonia’s capital Tallin.

From Tallin airport we had a two hour bus ride to Tartu, where the Lähte gymnasium is located.

When we arrived in Tartu we checked in into the hotel and had first contact with the students from the other countries which also lived in the same hallway as we did.

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Thursday, 4th October 2018

After the breakfast at the hotel the day could start.

A bus took all students from the hotel to Lähte gymnasium.

There we were welcomed by the Estonian English teacher.

Also some Estonian students gave concerts for us.

After the songs and the choir, we got the week’s program which explained what we would do the whole week.



After that the British and our group presented the presentation about renewable energy which we had to prepare at home. We, the Germans, showed our video, which was produced before going to Estonia. Some of us also held a presentation about renewable energy in Germany.

When the presentations were finished we were divided into four groups, each with another task for the upcoming week.

There were 1. The video group, 2. The photo group, 3. The blogger group and 4. The brochure group.

We had time to brainstorm ideas before we had to go to lunch.

After that we took a bus to Tartu where we were dropped off in the city center and had to walk through some housing areas, to get to the city’s university. There the university teachers tried to explain things about renewable energy and heating to us. But it was hard to understand because of the big language barrier between the teachers and us.

When the tour had finished we all went back to the hotel.

There we had a few minutes time to rest, before a few of the students went ice skating. We were invited by the Estonians to go to a mall, go ice skating and to have dinner.

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Friday, 5th October 2018

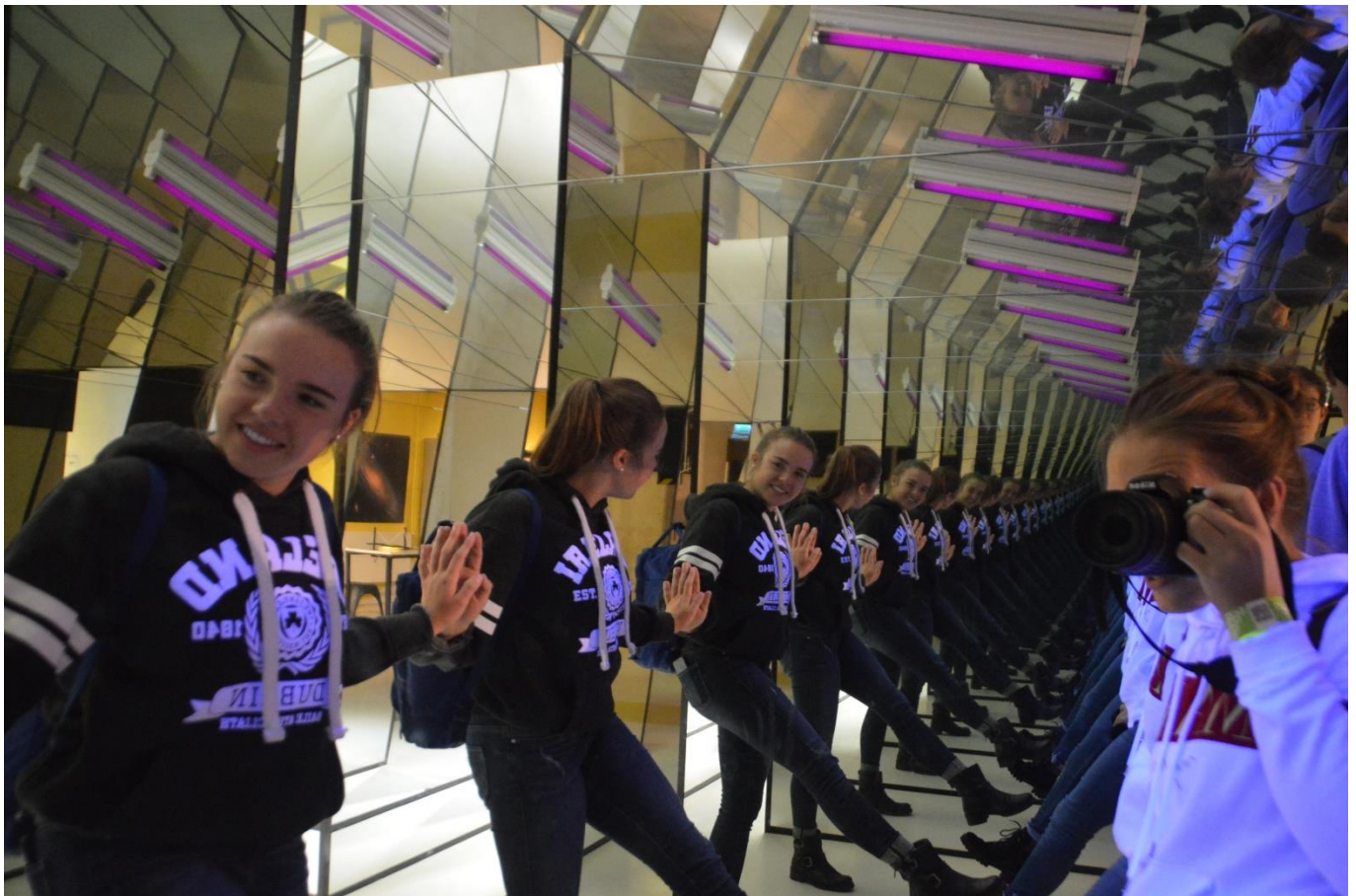
After Breakfast we had a city tour through Tartu. There we could look at the old town and also visited an old church. After that the Major of Tartu introduced himself to us and had a short presentation about the university city Tartu. The teachers and the Major also exchanged presents for each other.

We had lunch in an old gunpowder cellar, which was a really nice location. The food did also taste really good.

After Lunch we headed to the Tartu Environmental education Centre where we looked at a few plants and animals and got told how climate change affects the wildlife.

Next up, a bus took us to the ice age Centre where we had a guided tour. The tour wasn't that interesting and also had nothing to do with our topic, so all students started to explore the Centre on their own.

After Dinner at the Ice Age Centre we went back to Tartu to spend the last hours in the AHA Science Centre right next to our hotel. The things in there were mostly made for children, but despite that it was still quite fun.



In the evening a few of the exchange students did a room escape together with some Estonians. The room escape was the most interesting and challenging thing today.



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Saturday, 6th October 2018

Today was Tallin day.

In the morning we took the bus to Estonia’s capital.

After the 2,5 hour bus ride we got off and looked at the presidents residence and at the music festival location as well.

After a tour through the old city and a short show in the energy discovery centre we were free to roam around the city.



After dinner we went back to Tartu by bus.

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Sunday, 7th October 2018

Today we went hiking in the woods.

After Breakfast we drove to south Estonia, where we went for a hike in the woods and in the swamplands. We visited a lake and later took the bus to a riverside reserve.

In the afternoon we went around the new city centre in Tartu.

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Monday, 8th October 2018

Today we worked at school, every group had almost the whole day to put together their materials gathered over the last week.

I was in the video group. We sketched out our plan for the film and filmed the last scenes. After that we cut all scenes together and finished right in time before the presentation of all projects.
