Dear student,

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Wednesday, 28th November 2018

On Wednesday we met again in the library and some representatives of local businesses came to the high school and then the panel discussion took place. From every country there were one to two students who summed up all the information of the presentations from the day before. Then the representatives introduced their companies and answered some questions all students could ask. They also gave us tips how to choose wisely and prepare for the world of work.



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Thursday, 29th November 2018

On Thursday a bus took all the Erasmus people to Edinburgh where we visited Edinburgh castle. We had the chance to look around by ourselves to get to know some of scotland's history. Then we had free time to go shopping or to explore Edinburgh. In the evening we walked through a german christmas market where you could buy many german things to eat and to drink.



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Friday, 30th November 2018

In the morning we made groupswith at leat one student of every country and created brochures where we wrote comments about what we liked in scotland, what we didn't like that much and what we would improve. After that all the Erasmus people had dance lessons in the gym hall where some younger scottish students showed us some scottish dances. We learned them as well and in the evening at the Ceilid we all enjoyed to dane the dances we just learned that day. This festive evening was our last and there were tears when it was time to say good bye.
